RAY OF HOPE TO A HELPLESS FAMILY

Siba Sankar Barik, three year-old son of Manas Barik of Diyarasahi, Kalapada Panchayat, Cuttack, was diagnosed with liver disease. He was undergoing treatment at SCB Medical College and Hospital, Cuttack for the past two years. The family was poor and was under severe financial constraints. Senior leader Sri Pravat Biswal had already been providing financial assistance to the family for the last two years but his health condition did not improve. Thus, the doctor advised to shift him to The Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences, Delhi for further treatment. The helpless family could not shift their son due to financial constraints and restrictions of travel imposed during the pandemic.

Upon getting the information, Odisha-Mo Parivar made all necessary financial and logistical arrangements to shift the patient from Cuttack to Delhi. Also, all required navigational help was provided through the SPOC member Sri Akshay Samal, appointed by Odisha-Mo Parivar at Delhi, who provided accommodation & assistance at the hospital at New Delhi.



PAYING OBEISANCE TO THE DEPARTED



Odisha-Mo Parivar has been serving all and stands by people in distress with a motto "All for each-each for all". Apart from the regular activities such as providing navigational service in hospitals, fulfilling the blood requirements etc. Odisha-Mo Parivar also started helpdesks at cremation grounds, in order to help the family members of the deceased during the cremation activity.

During this pandemic it has been found that many dead bodies are being left unattended out of which many are unidentified bodies which results in an unhygienic environment in the hospital premises. Looking into this matter, Odisha-Mo Parivar circulated an advisory to all its stakeholders to cremate the unidentified bodies. In the month of July, a body was left unattended at DHH Balasore for 4 days. Upon getting the information, BYJD State Working President Suvendu Mangaraj made the required arrangements for the cremation of the deceased.

MAJOR INTERVENTIONS OF THE MONTH THROUGH HELPDESK



Pabitra Mohan Muduli, a young social worker from Brahmagiri, Puri, suffered from brain stroke in the month of June and was admitted at SCB Medical College & Hospital. During the treatment, he was in dire need of an ICU bed which was difficult to get, due to rush of patients during the pandemic.

Sri Sanjay Kumar Dasburma, Deputy Chairman, State Planning Board, after receiving information regarding the case, informed Jeevan Bindu Cuttack City Coordinator, Sri Ranjan Biswal. Sri Biswal along with helpdesk operator Sandeep Rath coordinated with the doctors and an ICU bed was arranged for the patient.

Pabitra was under treatment in the ICU for a period 13 days. During this period, Sri Biswal and our Helpdesk operator Sandeep Rath maintained a regular follow-up. As a result, Pabitra has now fully recovered and has returned home, and he is deeply grateful to Odisha-Mo Parivar for the support extended during his difficult time.



56 year old Mayadhar Panda, of Nayagarh district, was critically injured in an accident. His left leg hip was broken and he was rushed to AIIMS Hospital in Bhubaneswar for treatment. Mayadhar had no one in the family except his wife, and his wife was crying as she was unaware of the hospital procedures. Our helpdesk operator Somnath noticed them and provided assistance in regards to the registration and admission process. During the course of treatment, Mayadhar was in need of O+ve blood in intervals. Our helpdesk operator maintained a regular follow-up and ensured the

provision of blood and other necessary navigational services in time. Somnath also helped to enroll the patient's name under the BSKY Scheme for free treatment. After being treated for around 15 days, Mayadhar has recovered and has been discharged. His wife has expressed gratitude for standing by them in their time of need.



An unidentified elderly man was lying helpless on the streets of Gajapati Nagar in Berhampur district. MLA Sri Bikram Panda after getting information regarding this, informed helpdesk operator Girija Satpathy, stationed at MKCG Berhampur, to look after the case. Soon the helpdesk operator reached the location, took the elderly man to the hospital and admitted him in the ID ward for treatment. Presently he is under observation and a regular follow-up is being maintained.



Jugal Kishore Mani of Khorda district suffering from paralysis was admitted in SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar and was undergoing treatment. As his health condition started to deteriorate, doctors advised to admit him to the neuroscience ICU immediately. Despite best efforts of Doctor, Jugal lost his life in the wee hours of 14th July. His family were under financial burden and were seeking help to transfer the mortal remains back to their native. Sri Sameer Pradhan after getting the information informed our helpdesk operator Siba Rout to look into the matter. Siba reached the hospital and made necessary arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital back to their native.



Namita Giri of Bhogarai, Balasore district was suffering from Pneumonia and was admitted to SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar. She was under treatment for around 10 days but lost her life on 13th July. The bereaved family were deeply saddened and were also worried about transferring the mortal remains back to their native. Somehow they got in touch with our helpdesk operator Siba Rout and explained about their helpless situation. Thereafter required arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains back to their native in Bhogarai.



17-year-old Mahendra Gouda of Koraput district was suffering from brain malaria and undergoing treatment at Saheed Laxman Nayak Medical College and Hospital, Koraput. During treatment, his health condition started to deteriorate and his platelet count also dropped. Hence, the doctor advised to shift him to MKCG Berhampur immediately. The family was completely helpless and were under financial constraints. Our helpdesk operator Baikuntha Mandal, stationed at the hospital noticed the family crying for help and immediately made logistical arrangements to shift the patient to Berhampur. The family after reaching MKCG Berhampur were assisted with all registration and admission related procedures by our helpdesk operator Girija Satpathy, stationed at the hospital in Berhampur. The patient was provided with A+ve blood on time. After being treated for around 13 days, Mahendra completely recovered and got discharged from the hospital.



Debendra Majhi, a resident of Tentuli village in Mayurbhanj district, died of a heart attack while undergoing treatment at SCB Medical College & Hospital, Cuttack. His family members were unable to complete the hospital procedures and were under financial constraints to transfer the mortal remains, because of which the body was lying in the hospital for around 6 hours. Cuttack city coordinator Sri Ranjan Biswal after getting information about the incident reached the hospital and in coordination with helpdesk operator Sandeep, helped the family to complete the paper work and provided logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from Cuttack to Mayurbhanj.



43 year old Debasish Ray Choudhury of Cuttack, was undergoing treatment at a Gastro Clinic in Bhubaneswar. During the course of his treatment a surgery was scheduled for which there was dire need of the rare O-ve blood. Despite running to various blood banks in the city, his family was unable to arrange the rare blood. Odisha-Mo Parivar Helpdesk operator Bikash Behera after getting the information regarding the issue, ensured timely availability of the rare O-ve blood for the surgery.



Rahul Rout, a 17-year-old boy of Puri district, was suffering from blood cancer and undergoing treatment at Acharya Harihar Cancer Hospital, Cuttack. Even though they were entitled for free treatment at the hospital, still they had to bear additional charges for certain medicines which were not available in the hospital. Since the family was financially weak, there was a desperate cry for medicines for their son's treatment. Odisha-Mo Parivar team upon getting information regarding the patient, provided financial help to ensure that the patient gets the required medicines on time.



Two children Madar and Bhagwan Jani of Kalahandi district were left forlorn after losing their parents. They worked hard as daily laborers to earn their meals. Because of the strenuous work, Bhagwan fell ill and couldn't even afford to go to hospital for treatment.

As the condition worsened, the villagers somehow made arrangements and rushed him to Kesinga Hospital in an ambulance. Further he was shifted to DHH Bhawanipatna for better treatment. During the course of treatment there was need of the rare AB+ve blood which was intimated to our helpdesk operator Himansu Naik stationed at DHH Bhawanipatna through Babuli Mandal, a prominent social activist from Kalahandi. Thereafter our helpdesk operator arranged the required blood for the treatment and maintained a regular follow-up with the patient.



4 years old child Anjali Rana of Kalahandi district was suffering from brain malaria and was under treatment at Sishu Bhawan, Cuttack. She breathed her last on 14th July. Her family was heartbroken and helpless, as they were financially weak and were unable to take her mortal remains back to their village. After waiting for around 12 hours the matter came into notice of Ex-Minister Sri Puspendra Singh Deo who further informed Cuttack city coordinator Sri Ranjan Biswal regarding the incident. Thereafter Sri Biswal along with Helpdesk operator Sandeep went to the hospital and provided logistical assistance to the family to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital back to their native place.



Puspanjali Majhi of Kalahandi district, wanted to pursue higher education but was left behind with sufferings for the last 7 years due to an abnormal growth of bone in her right hand. Despite running from pillar to post, she was deprived of getting the right treatment as the family was under financial stress. Her father Nabeen Majhi had even appealed to the government to help them regarding this matter.

On 30th July our helpdesk operator Himansu Naik noticed Puspanjali along with her family, who were sitting in a very hopeless situation in the premises of DHH Bhawanipatna. He then assisted them with all documentation and admission process. Also a regular follow-up is being maintained with the patient.

JEEVAN BINDU BLOOD DONATION PROGRAM

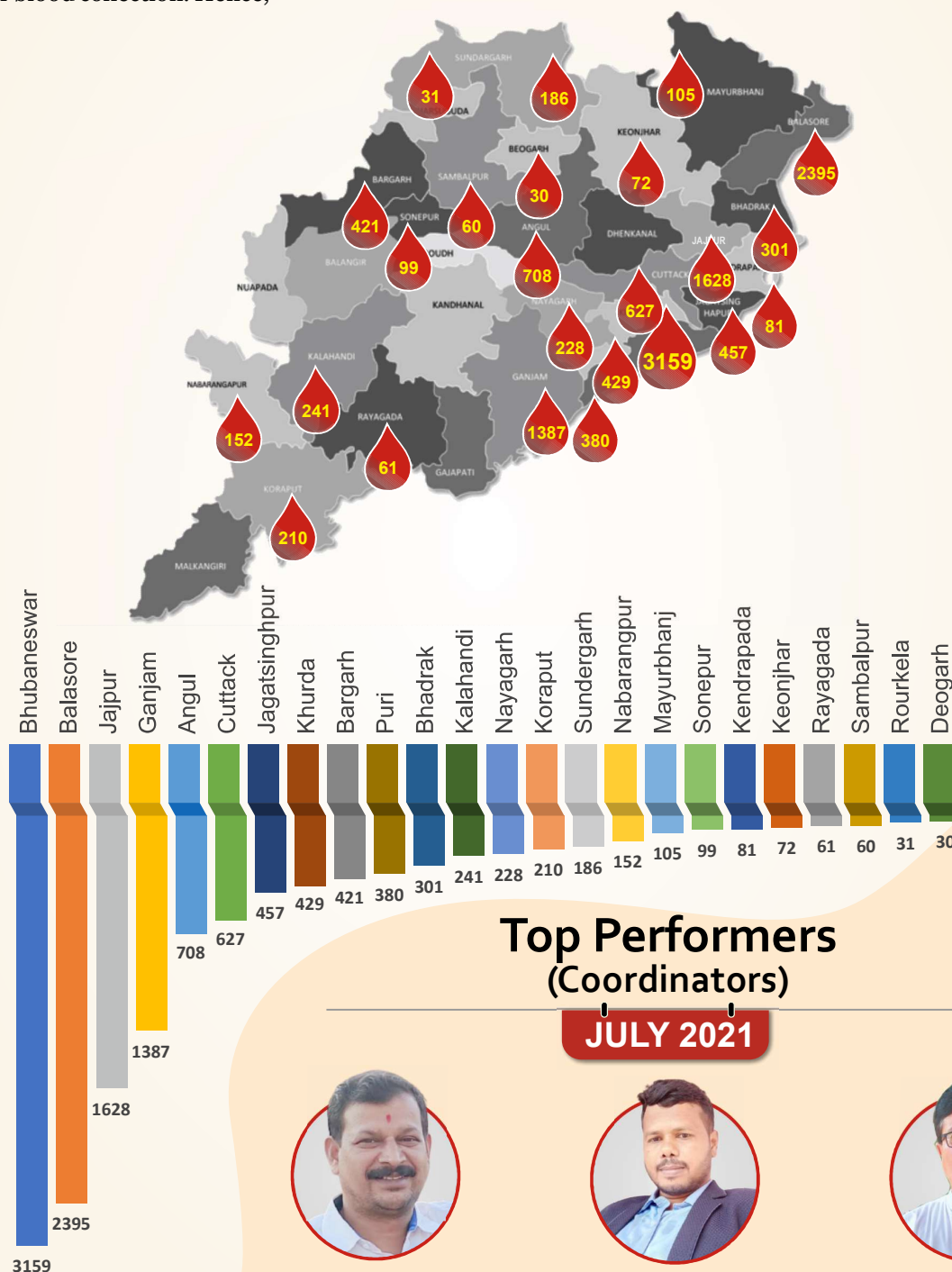

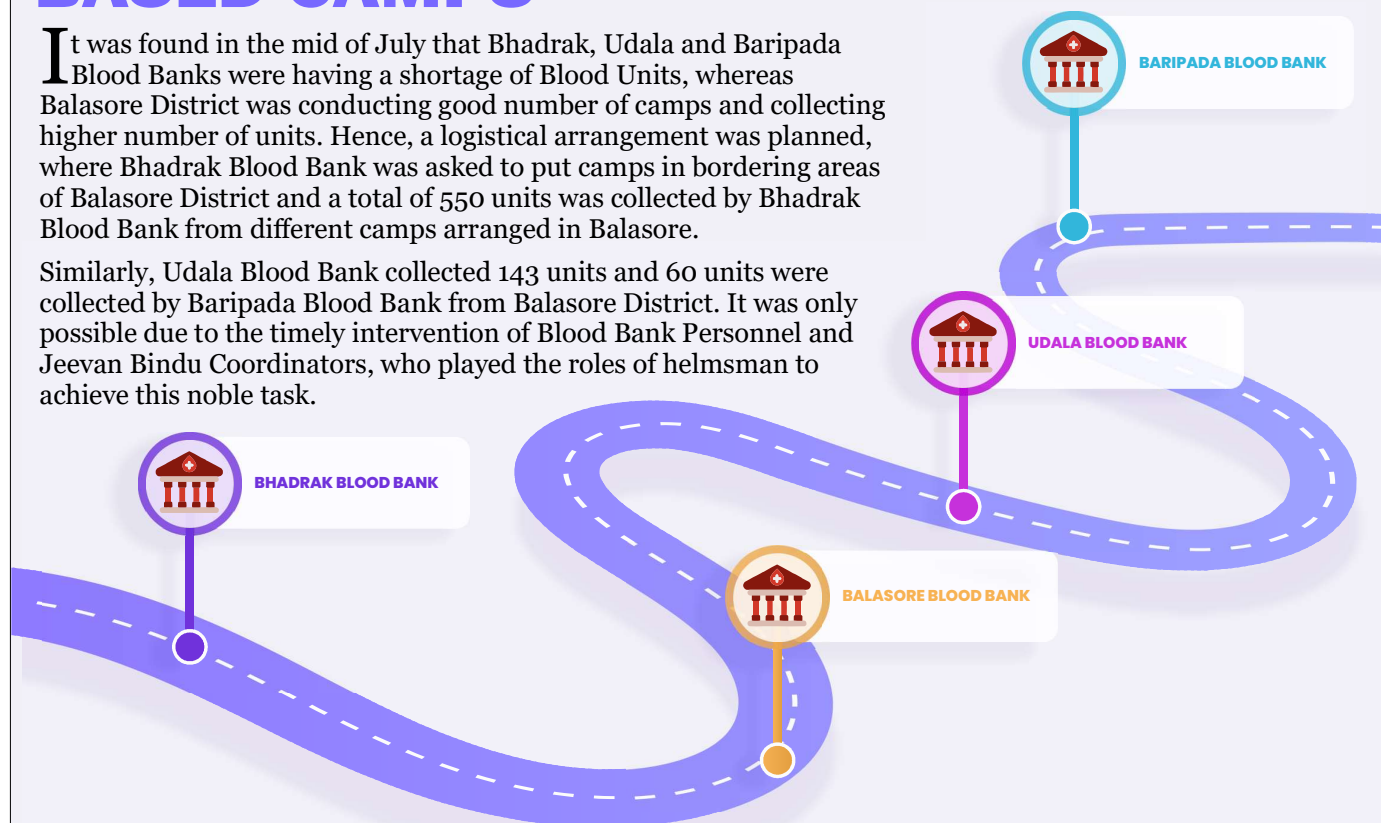

On top of this, the restrictions imposed during the pandemic further reduce the turn-out of the donors. In spite of these challenging situation, in the month of July, 7 differently abled persons came forward to donate blood in blood donation camps organized on 13th & 14th July at Bhubaneswar and have set an example for all. They are Kanhu Charan Sahoo, Pramod Dehury, Bansidhar Pradhan, Munindra Nayak, Sabitri Bal, Pratima Sahu & Dusmant Sahoo. Their contribution for this noble cause was also appreciated by the Honorable Chief Minister through a tweet.



NEED AND CAPACITY BASED CAMPS

It was found in the mid of July that Bhadrak, Udala and Baripada Blood Banks were having a shortage of Blood Units, whereas Balasore District was conducting good number of camps and collecting higher number of units. Hence, a logistical arrangement was planned, where Bhadrak Blood Bank was asked to put camps in bordering areas of Balasore District and a total of 550 units was collected by Bhadrak Blood Bank from different camps arranged in Balasore.

Similarly, Udala Blood Bank collected 143 units and 60 units were collected by Baripada Blood Bank from Balasore District. It was only possible due to the timely intervention of Blood Bank Personnel and Jeevan Bindu Coordinators, who played the roles of helmsman to achieve this noble task.



HUMANITY WINS - POLITICS TAKES A BACK SEAT

Leaving the political rivalry aside, General Secretary, Biju Chhatra Janata Dal (Keonjhar) S.K.Safiq has set an example upholding human values.

On 10th July, BJP's youth leader Kundan Kumar Sahu met with an accident near Jhumpura, Keonjhar & sustained serious injuries to both legs. S K Safiq was on the way where he noticed the accident and rushed to his rescue. Kundan was shifted to a nearby hospital immediately. There he was in dire need of the rare AB+ve blood and coincidentally Safiq's blood group was also the same and he donated blood for Kundan's treatment. Since Kundan's condition was critical, the doctor advised him to shift to SCB Medical Cuttack. Safiq also accompanied him to Cuttack and ensured proper treatment at the hospital. Safiq's contribution in the time of need was highly praised by everyone.



ODISHA-MO PARIVAR ENSURED SAFE RETURN OF A MISSING PERSON



A -70-year old person was lying unconscious in the parking lot of SCB Medical College & Hospital, Cuttack. Our helpdesk operator after noticing him took him to the casualty for initial check-up and provided him with food. Since the person was in trauma, efforts to ascertain his identity proved to be futile, but our helpdesk operator on further inspection found a diary in his pocket, in which he was identified as Chaitan Hembram, after which he dialed a few numbers through which he could establish communication with his neighbor. It was then found that the person was missing for the last 4 days from Salia Sahi Basti, Bhubaneswar.

After the initial aid, when the person became stable, he narrated that he had met with an accident and was left unattended in the parking lot of the hospital. His wife at Saliasahi basti was petrified as she had no clue about his husband's whereabouts since the past 4 days. Thereafter, the entire matter was notified to Sri Sameer Pradhan, Joint secretary (Odisha-Mo Parivar) who provided logistical support and also ensured the safe return of Chaitan to his home.

Odisha-Mo Parivar's Cancer care interventions for the month of July

Odisha-Mo Parivar in partnership with Konark Cancer Foundation is providing assistance to cancer patients since January 2021. Odisha-Mo Parivar refers the cancer patients to Konark Cancer Foundation for further consultation regarding their treatment. Konark Cancer Foundation provides logistical, emotional and financial support to the cancer patients. It also provides detailed information regarding various health schemes and helps the patients and their family members getting accommodation & internal Co-ordination for documentation & treatment at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. In the month of July 2021, Odisha-Mo Parivar referred 15 such cases to Konark Cancer Foundation, which have been intervened successfully and a regular follow-up is also being maintained.



K Anita Subudhi, 44 year old, suffering from Breast Cancer is undergoing Chemotherapy at Capital Hospital, Bhubaneswar. She has been provided with navigational help in the hospital and a regular follow-up is also being maintained. She has also been provided with artificial Breast Prosthetics by Konark Cancer Foundation.

Dibakar Behera, 37 year old, suffering from Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma cancer is presently undergoing treatment at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. He was assisted by Konark Cancer Foundation for new registration and submission of all required documents. He has also been helped for getting accommodation near the hospital.



Bikash Kundu, 65 year old, suffering from Thoracic Cancer, has been provided help for new registration and required documentation for the tests. Rs 2 Lakhs was arranged from I.C.S (Indian Cancer Society) through TMH M.S.W (Medical Social worker) department and applied for CM, PMNRF fund. The patient has been provided with reasonable accommodation, from where he comes regularly for check-up at Tata Memorial Hospital Mumbai. KCF has also arranged regular ration for the patient.

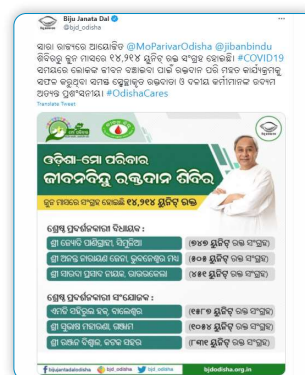
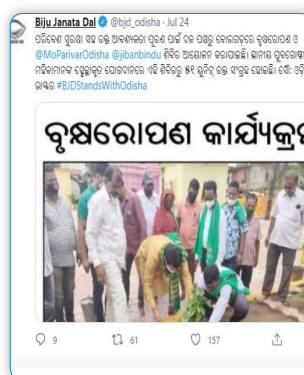
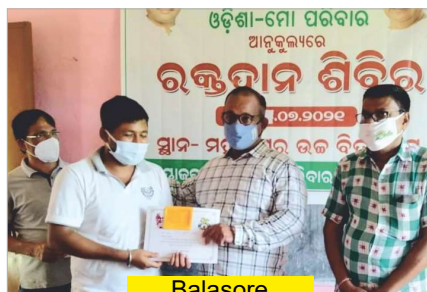
