Prasant Rescued From Saudi

Prasant Jayasingh, a 49-year-old resident of Puri, had been to Saudi Arab to work in a Pvt. Ltd. Company (Ocean Sky Equipment Rental Company) on 9th January. On 11th February, the family got a call from his colleague, who informed that Prasant has been admitted to Jubail General Hospital, Saudi Arabia, following sudden illness.

The family members tried to contact Prasant but got no response. This matter came to the notice of Odisha-Mo Parivar through MLA Sri Umakanta Samantaray and was intimated to Dr. Arun Praharaj, our SPOC at Gulf, who actively intervened in the matter.

Dr. Praharaj contacted the hospital and maintained a follow-up with the hospital to ensure proper treatment of the patient. After Prashant was declared fit to travel by the hospital authority, Dr. Praharaj coordinated with the embassy and all required arrangements were made to shift him from the hospital to his native place.

Prashant was shifted from Saudi Arabia to Odisha via air. He was received by Sri Pramod Mohanty, our SPOC at Kolkata Airport, who provided required assistance to shift the patient from the airport to his native place at Puri.

Eye Checkup Camp by Odisha-Mo Parivar

An eye camp in collaboration with LV Prasad Eye Institute was organized at Nageswar Tangi, Bhubaneswar which was coordinated by Sri Nrupesh Nayak (coorporator). Out of 64 attendees, 16 were identified for surgery and 26 were prescribed for glasses.



From Hospital To Crematorium

Sumitra Jena, a resident of Bhadrak was admitted to SCB, Cuttack for her treatment. She was being taken care of by her elderly mother, who was completely helpless. Our helpdesk associate Sandeep Rath, stationed at the hospital, maintained a follow-up with the patient and her elderly mother and helped them in required assistance at the hospital.

Unfortunately, Sumitra lost her life during the course of her treatment. Her mother who was grief stricken, was clueless as to how she would perform the last rites, since she was completely alone.

Immediately, Sandeep discussed the matter with our Jeevan Bindu coordinator Sri Ranjan Biswal who reached at the hospital and made required arrangements to shift the mortal remains from the hospital to Swargadwar, Cuttack.

Since, there was no one on behalf of the family to conduct the last rites, Sandeep contacted Sri

Emergency Treatment Provided To A Needy Patient

Manas Majhi, a 23-year-old resident of Nirakarpur, met with an accident on 15th March from where he was taken to a hospital at Khordha. After being provided with emergency treatment, the patient was shifted to Capital hospital for further treatment. Sri Mrutyunjay

Pradhan, a social worker informed the Convenor, Odisha-Mo Parivar, seeking help for his treatment at Capital hospital. As per the guidance of the Convenor, Odisha-Mo Parivar team immediately rushed to the hospital and all necessary arrangements were made before the patient reached the hospital.

After his recovery, required logistical arrangements were made to shift him to his native place at Nirakarpur. During a visit of the Convenor to Nirakarpur on 30th March, he met with Manas, who expressed his gratitude for the much-needed help during his difficult times.



Odisha-Mo Parivar's Service Round The Clock

Dwijabar Sahu, a 77-year-old resident of Sion Sramika Basti of Ward No. 13, Bhubaneswar, was diagnosed with oral cancer 7 months ago and was undergoing treatment at Acharya Harihar Cancer Hospital, Cuttack. He used to earn his living by selling utensils and vegetables in his small shop. Unfortunately, he lost his life in the midnight of 12th March which left the family helpless and clueless as to how to conduct the last rites.

Smt. Itishree Das, corporator of the ward, upon getting information regarding the case, approached Sri Rudra Samantaray, joint secretary, Odisha-Mo Parivar seeking help to conduct the last rites.

Odisha-Mo Parivar team immediately reached the spot in the midnight and the mortal remains were transferred to the Satyanagar crematorium through Jai Odisha's hearse vehicle 'Sesha Saathi', where the last rites were performed.

Ensuring Proper Treatment For Arun

Arjun Harijan, a resident of Koraput left his home to work as a daily labourer in other state in order to earn money, so that he could run his family and get his son proper treatment.

Arjun's son Arun, 3-year-old, was suffering from a severe swelling on his neck. The family was under financial stress and hence, Arun's mother sold her mobile and certain other commodities and gathered some amount to take her son to SLNMCH, Koraput for treatment.

The doctor advised to shift the patient to MKCG, Berhampur for further treatment. Upon hearing this, the family got tensed and was utterly helpless in this matter since they didn't have any money to shift their son to Berhampur.

Baikuntha discussed this matter with Sri Panigrahi and with the help of the collector, funds were arranged to shift the patient. Baikuntha and few other volunteers at the hospital also provided some amount to the family for emergency requirements. Baikuntha assisted in making logistical arrangements and intimated our helpdesk associate Girija Satpathy at MKCG, Berhampur to attend the patient. After the family reached MKCG, Berhampur, Girija attended them and helped with required assistance at the hospital.

This matter was highlighted in the media which came to the notice of Sri Iswar Panigrahi (BJD District President), who intimated the matter to our helpdesk associate Sri Baikuntha Mandal stationed at the hospital, who immediately rushed to the family at the hospital and helped them with required assistance.

Successful Surgery Under BSKY

Abhaya Kumar Rout, a resident of Patkura, Kendrapara had a sudden heart attack in the late night of 15th March and was unconscious. The family tried to pump his heart and luckily Abhaya was back in his senses. However, his family members were worried and not sure where to take him for proper treatment.

Somehow, the family got in touch with our helpdesk associate Rashmi Ranjan Pradhan, stationed at SUM hospital who guided them to visit the hospital. Very next day Abhaya was admitted to SUM hospital and Rashmi helped the family with the required medical assistance.

After consultation, Abhaya was diagnosed with heart blockage and was advised for immediate surgery. His surgery was done completely free of cost under BSKY scheme which was successful and 2 stents worth lakhs, were also implanted under the scheme.

After his recovery, he and his family expressed their gratitude towards the Hon'ble CM and Odisha-Mo Parivar and the selfless service provided by helpdesk associate throughout the course of the treatment.

Ashish Mohanty, a 21-year-old resident of Nayagarh, met with an accident on 10th March and was admitted to DHH Nayagarh. He had

sustained serious injuries on his head and was advised to be shifted to a hospital in Bhubaneswar for further treatment.

Ashish was shifted to a private hospital in Bhubaneswar but the hospital didn't admit him and asked to shift him to some other hospital. The family didn't have much idea about the hospitals in Bhubaneswar and contacted Ms. Linkan Subudhi, State General Secretary, BMJD, who discussed the matter with Odisha-Mo Parivar. Upon getting the information, Rashmi Ranjan coordinated with the required procedures and paperwork for treatment under the BSKY scheme at Vivekananda Hospital. Rashmi stood by the family till the patient recovered and got discharged.

The family expressed their immense gratitude to the Hon'ble CM and for the selfless service by Odisha-Mo Parivar and helpdesk associate Rashmi.

Kin Receives Mortal Remains

SK Ajiz, a 73-year-old resident of Bhadrak was waiting at the Howrah station with his son, SK Rasid, to board a train to his native place at Bhadrak. Unfortunately, he breathed his last at the railway station platform and the body was recovered by the GRP. All the required procedures were carried out by the police but the body was not handed over to the deceased's son.

Upon getting information, Odisha-Mo Parivar discussed with the police and with the family. An authorization letter on behalf of the deceased's wife was issued by the ward counsellor and was submitted for the clearance. Since the family was under financial stress, the matter was discussed with MLA Sri Sanjeev Mallick, who supported the family for logistical arrangements to transfer the

Service To A Family As A Family

Maheswar Behera, a 64-year-old resident of Jagatsinghpur while travelling in train to Kolkata, felt uneasy and fainted. He was rescued by the GRP and was taken to Khantapada Medical College, Balasore.

Unfortunately, he was declared dead at the hospital due to a cardiac arrest. Since, he was travelling

alone, there was no one at the hospital to claim his body. The family was contacted by the police to reach and receive the body but there was no such member to travel and take over the responsibility. The family contacted their MLA Sri Prasanta Kumar Muduli to help them with the process and bring back the mortal remains.

Sri Muduli discussed this matter with our NRO, advisor, Sri Surendra Mohapatra. Upon getting information from Sri Mohapatra, our Jeevan Bindu coordinator guided our helpdesk associate Mrutyunjay Maharana stationed at Balasore to look into the case.

Upon the request of Sri Mohapatra, the police handed over the body to Mrutyunjay, which was shifted to DHH Balasore for post-mortem. After that, with the help of few volunteers, funds were arranged and required arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital to their native place at Jagatsinghpur. The family expressed their gratitude for standing by them as a family during their tough times.

Last Rites Of Unattended Bodies

Odisha- Mo Parivar under its mandate to conduct the last rites of unidentified and unattended bodies, recovered at various places of the city, came across three such cases in the month of March.

1 On 16th March, a body was recovered near Badambadi bus stand, Cuttack which, upon investigation was found to be left unattended since past 3-4 days. The matter came into the notice of Sri Ranjan Biswal, Jeevan Bindu coordinator (Cuttack city) who immediately reached at the spot. Logistical arrangements were made to shift the dead body to the crematorium. Sri Biswal along with social workers Sri Abhimanyu, Sri Jagatjyoti Pattnaik, Sri Bikram Chatoi and our helpdesk associate Sandeep Rath, conducted the last rites of the unattended body. The local residents appreciated this selfless service by Odisha-Mo Parivar.

2 A lady was found roaming near Capital Hospital area who was rescued by the staffs of Patita Udhara Samiti on 21st March in the morning and same day in the evening she had a chest pain and was brought to the Capital Hospital for check-up but unfortunately she breathed her last. This was informed to the Capital Police Station by the staff of Patita Udhara Samiti. Since there was no identity of the lady and no claimant, the body was kept in the mortuary for 96 hours.

Similarly, another unidentified body was found hanging on a tree at Mancheswar. The local residents informed this to the police. Nobody approached to claim the body even after putting various notice in the newspapers.

Upon getting information about the above cases, Sri Rudra Samantaray, Joint secretary (Odisha-Mo Parivar) & team reached and transferred the bodies to the Satyanagar crematorium through Jai Odisha's hearse vehicle 'Sesha Saathi', where the last rites were performed along with the police.



Major Interventions By Helpdesk Associates

Provided Rare Blood



Suprava Parida, a 37-year-old resident of Kendrapada was admitted to a private hospital at Cuttack for her delivery.

Being a thalassemia patient, she used to have frequent blood requirements & during her delivery, there was an urgent need of rare AB-ve which the family was unable to arrange and approached our helpdesk associate Sandeep Rath who immediately discussed with Sri Ranjan Biswal, our Jeevan Bindu coordinator (Cuttack city), who arranged the required units of blood from Red Cross.

Basanti Mahalik, a 40-year-old from Balasore was admitted to DHH Balasore for a surgery.

During the surgery, there was an urgent need of rare AB-ve blood for the patient. The family was unable to arrange the same and approached our helpdesk associate Mrutyunjay Maharana. Soon, Mrutyunjay discussed with the hospital authority and one unit of blood was provided to the patient in emergency. Mrutyunjay also helped the family in required medical assistance during the course of treatment of the patient and ensured safe return of the patient after she recovered and got discharged from the hospital.

Logistical arrangement to transfer the mortal remains

Suraj Kumar Padi, a 47-year-old resident of Ganjam, suffering from heart related issues was admitted to Care hospital, Visakhapatnam. As per the doctor's advice, he went through a heart surgery. Earlier he was admitted and got treated for brain hemorrhage.

After the heart surgery, Suraj's health further deteriorated and the doctor intimated that there was less chance for his survival. The family was completely shattered upon knowing this and somehow got in touch with our helpdesk associate Prakash Behera and requested him to help them to shift Suraj to another hospital.

Prakash helped in the process of shifting and documentation for treatment under BSKY scheme at Medicover hospital. But unfortunately even after the efforts of the team, Suraj couldn't survive. Later, Prakash helped the family in making logistical arrangements to shift the mortal remains from the hospital to their native place at Ganjam.

Pandit Rana, a 45-year-old resident of Kalahandi suffering from colon cancer visited DHH Bhawanipatna for check-up. After diagnosis, the doctor advised to visit VIMSAR Burla for further treatment.

Our helpdesk associate, Himanshu Naik at Bhawanipatna had helped the patient in required assistance at the hospital for getting doctor's consultation and required tests. He also helped the patient in required paperwork for treatment under the BSKY scheme and informed helpdesk associate Dharendra Suna at VIMSAR, Burla to attend the patient.

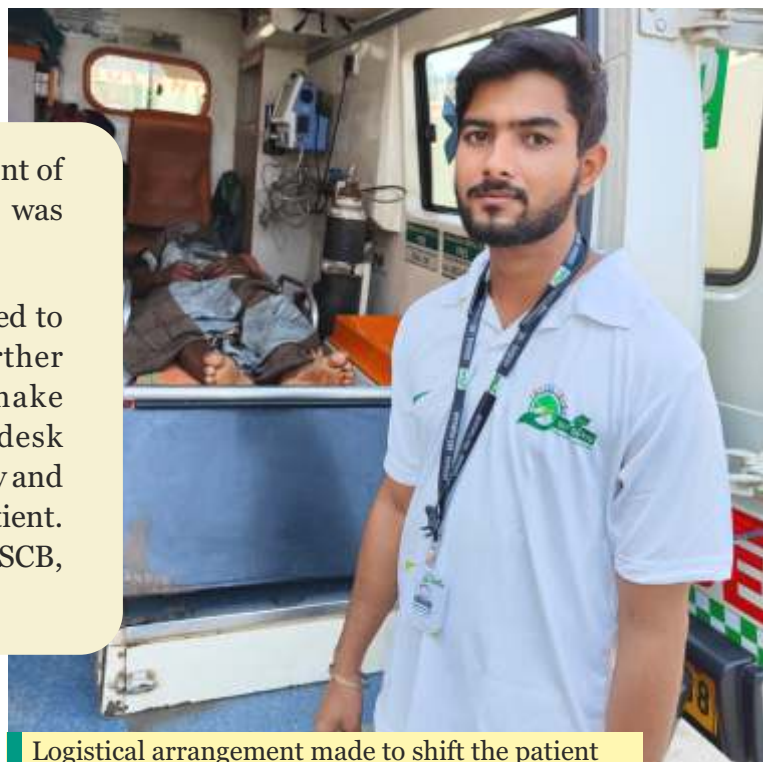
Logistical arrangement made to transfer mortal remains

Debendra Mohanta, a 53-year-old resident of Keonjhar had met with an accident and suffered severe injuries on his head and leg. After getting emergency treatment, he was shifted to SCB, Cuttack for further treatment.

Unfortunately, he succumbed to his injuries while undergoing treatment. The family was under stress and were roaming in the corridors of the hospital, who were noticed by Santosh Das, our helpdesk associate stationed at the hospital. Santosh assisted the family with the hospital procedures and helped in making logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital to their native place at Keonjhar.

Biswanath Hembram, a 45-year-old resident of Baripada, who was partially paralyzed, was admitted to PRMMCH, Baripada.

After few days of treatment, the doctor advised to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack for further treatment. The family was unable to make arrangements and approached our helpdesk associate Subham Bhatt, who helped the family and made required arrangements to shift the patient. He also intimated our helpdesk associates at SCB, Cuttack to look into the case.

Somanath helped them in the documentation procedure for the treatment and getting medicines free of cost from the counter through the scheme. Unsung HERO



GAGAN PAITAL

Gagan Paital, a resident of Jagatsinghpur, believes in the religion of humanity only and has performed the last rites of more than 1,500 people in the last 35 years. He performs the last rituals for even a decomposed body, which anyone would hate to do. He makes it a point to cremate bodies lying unattended or unidentified.

During 80's, Paital used to work as a postman and earned roughly 100 bucks which was very difficult for him to run his family. Hence, he decided to start giving tuitions to school students and started earning a handful amount for his family. One day while returning home, he observed a body which was lying on the road. He got to know that it has been lying for days and there were no claimant for it. Immediately, he took a step forward and cremated the body. Slowly, he started cremating more and more unclaimed bodies lying on the roads and in hospitals. Also, he started getting calls regarding unattended bodies for cremation.



Through his work, Paital also wants to create awareness about organ donation & whenever he is informed about an unclaimed body, he tries to find out whether his/her organs can be used.

His philanthropic work does not end there. Once, while returning home from work, he noticed an elderly lady sitting alone. When he approached her, instead of begging for money or food the lady asked him whether he could provide her with some clothes. Since then he decided to start distributing clothes to needy people. He distributes clothes to needy tribal people after



collecting them from well-to-do families and owns a storehouse at his home where he washes and irons clothes before distributing them among the needy.

Presently, this service has expanded throughout the state, especially in the Adivasi areas. Various voluntary organizations also contact him to provide clothes for distribution and they also join hands to collect clothes too.

For his generosity, he has been recognized by the Hon'ble Chief Minister and he has been felicitated with top awards like Danabira Harischandra, Debaduta, Change Agent of Odisha, Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Noble Award and many more awards by various organizations.

Bijay Bhoi (49) from Tangi had an infection on his left leg in 2000. Since the infection turned septic, his leg was amputated below the knee. He had availed a prosthetic through ALIMCO in the year 2005 but it was heavy and didn't fit properly. Upon getting to know about the facility of availing prosthetics by Odisha-Mo Parivar, he approached seeking help for the same and was guided to visit ARC, Capital hospital and after receiving the prosthetics the beneficiary expressed his gratitude.

Dambaru China (64) from Ganjam, was born with limb-length discrepancy. In 2020, an infection on his right leg led to septic and as per the doctor's advice, his right leg was amputated below the knee. He got to know about the facility of availing prosthetics by Odisha-Mo Parivar and approached seeking help for the same. He was guided by our health advisor Dr. Satyajit Dash to visit DDRC Ganjam. The case was handled by Dr. Murali Behera and the after availing the prosthetics the beneficiary expressed his gratitude for the service rendered.



Mahendra Kumar Aich (49) from Jajpur, had an infection on his right leg which turned septic. Unfortunately, his leg was amputated above the knee to stop the infection from spreading to further parts. He had availed a prosthetic from Olatpur which was heavy and eventually broke with use.

Similarly, Prasanta Kumar Swain (60) from Koraput, had met with an accident where his left leg

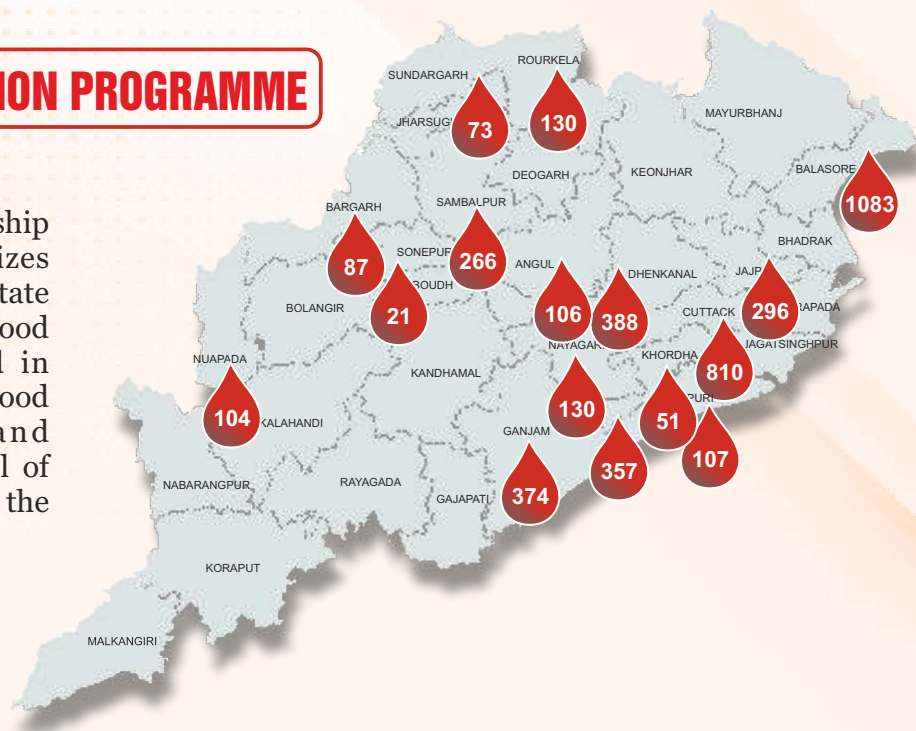
got torn off his body on the spot and was taken to a nearby hospital where a team of doctors tried to attach the amputated leg back in position but unfortunately, the leg started getting infected with time and was later amputated. He had availed prosthetics from Olatpur but he was not comfortable using the same.

Laxmi Priya Sahoo (41) from Bhubaneswar had boils on her left leg which turned septic and her leg was amputated below the knee & Shyamsundar Nayak (48) from Ganjam, had met with an accident where he got severe injuries in his right hand and had undergone surgery which later got infected and unfortunately his hand was amputated above the elbow.

All of them got to know about the facility of availing prosthetics by Odisha-Mo Parivar and approached Joint Secretary (Odisha-Mo Parivar) Sri Rudra Samantray seeking help for the same, who were guided to visit ARC Capital Hospital for measurements and expressed their gratitude after receiving the prosthetics.
