3 Migrant workers received at Kolkata Airport

Odisha-Mo Parivar Rescued 3 Odia Migrant Labourers from Saudi Arabia

Stranded migrant workers from Jajpur, Odisha had been to Saudi Arabia to work in a hotel named Shurfat Alhind Indian Restaurant. The five workers were being treated inhumanly by the employer and his son. The employer was not giving them the agreed salary as per the contract and signatures were taken forcefully on payment vouchers.

One of them managed to escape and appealed to the Government to rescue him and his fellow colleagues. Organizational Secretary (BJD) and Jajpur MLA, Sri Pranab Prakash Das upon getting information regarding the case, intimated the same to Odisha-Mo Parivar.

Upon getting the information, the matter was taken-up by Odisha-Mo Parivar. The matter was taken up at the highest level with the Government of India and Dr Arun Kumar Praharaj, who is appointed as the SPOC member by Odisha-Mo Parivar at Bahrain, stepped in to resolve the matter.

Dr. Praharaj co-ordinated with Dr. S. Jaishankar, Honorable External Affairs Minister and the External Affairs Ministry to rescue the migrants from the employer's custody.

Since November 2021, Dr. Praharaj & Odisha-Mo Parivar have been working relentlessly for the rescue, with active participation of Minister of Education, Skill Development Entrepreneurship, Government of India, Sri Dharmendra Pradhan and MP Dr. Sasmit Patra and out of the 5 stranded workers, three were brought back to Odisha in the month of January 2022.

Dr. Arun Kumar Praharaj made logistical arrangements from Dubai to Kolkata and after reaching at Kolkata International Airport, Sri Pramod Mohanty, SPOC member appointed by Odisha-Mo Parivar at Kolkata, made logistical arrangement for them to travel back to their native place in Jajpur, Odisha. Odisha-Mo Parivar is now working on to rescuing the remaining 2 migrant workers from Saudi Arabia.

Budhia Gouda, a resident of Ganjam district was working at a loom factory in Surat for the last 20 years. The 50-year-old was the only earning member of his family, who unfortunately breathed his last on 8th January due to brain stroke. The bereaved family were helpless and approached Odisha-Mo Parivar

to bring back the mortal remains. Upon getting the information, Odisha-Mo Parivar coordinated with Sri Pradeep Sahoo, appointed as SPOC member at Surat, who made necessary arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from Surat to their native place at Ganjam.

Mortal remains brought back from Vishakhapatnam

Sudarsan Mallick, 62-year-old of Sanekhamundi, Ganjam lost his life on 6th January 2022, at Tuni Railway station, while travelling from Maharashtra to his native place at Ganjam. The mortal remains was in custody of the GRP, Tuni and they intimated the family members regarding the same. The family were in helpless situation, as they did not have a clue on how bring back the mortal

remains from the station. This matter came into the notice of the Honourable CM's office, which was further intimated to Odisha-Mo Parivar. The matter was taken up and logistical arrangement was made to transfer the mortal remains from the railway station to Sanakhemundi. Former MLA of Sanakhemundi Smt Nandini Debi stood by the bereaved family during the last rites.

Financial assistance provided to a patient

B Baburao, a 55-year-old resident of Ganjam district had undergone heart surgery at Apollo Hospital, Bhubaneswar in June 2021 under the BSKY scheme.

During his routine check-up in the month of January 2022 at General OPD, he was detected with very high cholesterol, where the doctor immediately advised certain injections and medicine for the patient.

BSKY couldn't be availed for those injections, since the patient was not admitted and had been to the hospital for doctor's consultation only. The family was unable to bear the expense for those injections & medicine, due to financial constraints.

Upon getting the information, Odisha-Mo Parivar team immediately reached the hospital and provided financial assistance to the family to get the required injections and medicines for the patient's treatment.

Logistical arrangement made to shift a cancer patient

64-year-old Talada Kundana, a cancer patient of Garabandha, Gajapati district was undergoing treatment at Hi-tech hospital, Bhubaneswar.

The doctor discharged the patient, mentioning that no further treatment is needed for the patient. The patient had no one in his family other than his only daughter, who was in helpless situation, since she was unable to arrange an ambulance to return to their native place. Upon getting the information, Odisha-Mo Parivar made logistical arrangements to shift the patient from Hi-tech hospital to Gajapati and the entire process was co-ordinated by Jeevan Bindu coordinator Smt. Indira Patnaik.

Mortal remains of Odia youth brought back from Bangalore

Subindar Dalai, a resident of Bhubaneswar was working at a Finance company at Bangalore. The 22-year-old youth suffering from severe abdominal pain was admitted to a nearby hospital on 15th January 2022. Unfortunately, he breathed his last on 19th January while undergoing treatment at the hospital. The bereaved family who were under financial burden were seeking help to bring back the mortal remains of their son.

Odisha-Mo Parivar upon getting the information from OMP Member and MLA Sri Ananta Narayan Jena, made logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from Bangalore to Bhubaneswar and also stood by the family during the last rites.



