Minister and Co-convenor (Odisha-Mo Parivar) Shri Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak intimated the matter and immediately the Odisha-Mo Parivar team sprang into action and coordinated with the Indian Embassy at Sri Lanka and the company officials to complete the required legal procedures and expedite the process of transferring the mortal remains. Keeping the request, the company agreed to make arrangements to transfer mortal remains from Sri Lanka to Bhubaneswar.

The mortal remains after reaching at Bhubaneswar was received by Minister Shri Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak & Odisha-Mo Parivar team and logistical arrangements were made to transfer the same to their native place at Kendrapada. The family expressed their heartfelt gratitude to Odisha-Mo Parivar for the selfless service and standing by them during such difficult situation.

Providing a ray of hope to differently-abled Lipuna

Regaum, a 52-year-old resident of Bhubaneswar was admitted to Capital Hospital for a surgery.

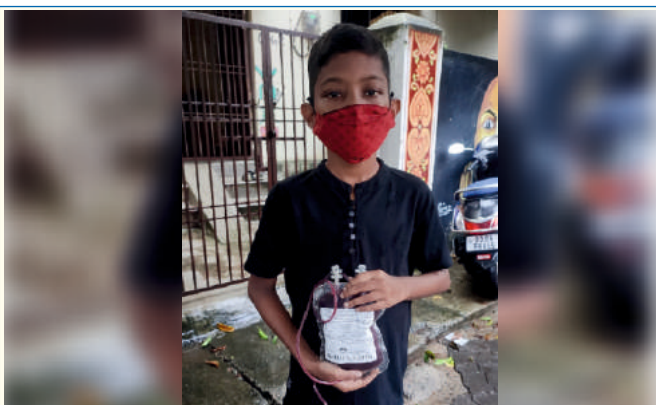

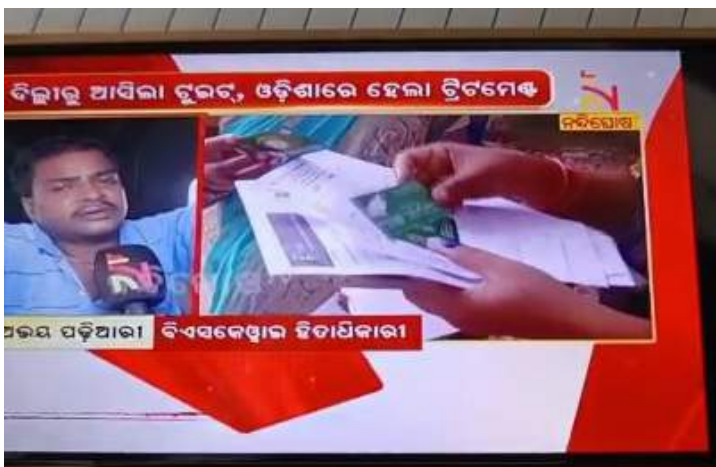
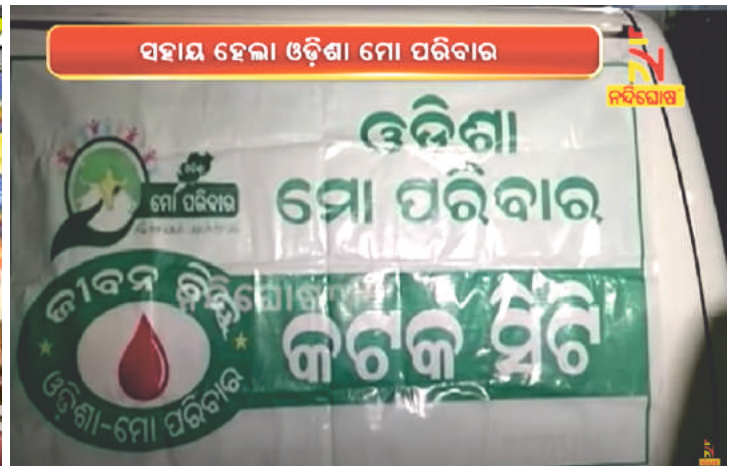
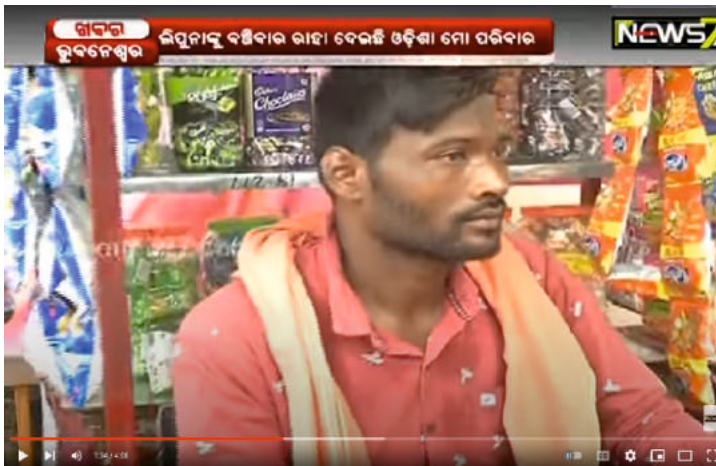
Dial/Tweet a Blood
