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Rescued After Continuous Trials And Tribulations



Mortal remains received at Viskhapatnam airport

Whenever any migrant Odia finds himself in trouble and gets clueless about how to find a path to safety, Odisha-Mo Parivar stands by them and puts in all possible efforts to rescue them.

Such was the case in the month of February. Late Krushnaprasad Ranjit, a 49-year-old resident of Niranjanpur, Jatni, had set up his business in Dubai for the last 20 years and was residing with his wife Asima Ranjit. He was suffering from high BP for the last 4

months and was admitted to Fakeeh University Hospital, Dubai Silicon Oasis where, unfortunately, he breathed his last due to a cardiac arrest and brain stroke and Asima was left completely alone.

She was under the burden of 4 legal cases against her and her husband due to some financial issues related to their business and a penalty of around 3 lakhs. Burdened with those legal issues she was also completely shaken by the sudden demise of her husband.

Jeevan Bindu – A Camp At New Delhi

Blood is the most essential part of the human body which helps patients survive surgeries, cancer treatment, chronic illnesses, traumatic injuries, etc. Keeping, blood donation as one of the major mandates of Odisha-Mo Parivar, blood donation camps are being organized throughout the state, through its flagship program “Jeevan Bindu”, to ensure an adequate supply of blood in every blood bank to be provided to needy patients in the nick of time. This initiative has been appreciated and recognized not only inside but outside the State also. For the first time, a blood donation camp was

organized outside the state by Odia Cultural & Welfare Association (OCWA) & Indian Red Cross Society in New Delhi under the aegis of Odisha-Mo Parivar. A total of 53 units were collected in the camp, which was coordinated by Shri Bibekananda Pattnaik (Advisor, Odisha-Mo Parivar).



Freed from the crippled life after 42 years

Kabindranath Sahu, a 42-year-old resident of Patakura, Kendrapara, was differently-abled since birth and was suffering from arthritis. He was facing issues with his daily chores and could not even stand without the help of any support. His village sarpanch upon getting to know about his miserable condition, informed MLA Smt. Sabitri Agarwalla who further informed her representative Sri Sanjay Agarwalla to look into the matter. Sri Agarwalla informed the matter to Odisha-Mo Parivar, seeking help for his surgery. Upon getting the information, Kabindranath was brought to SUM hospital and as per the doctor's advice he had to undergo knee and hip replacement surgery. His entire treatment was done under the BSKY scheme. Our help desk associates Rashmi Ranjan and Alok Ranjan helped the patient with the required assistance during the course of the treatment and also arranged 5 units of B-ve blood, required during the surgery. The surgery was successful and finally, Kabindranath could walk independently after years. He was highly overwhelmed by the selfless service provided by Odisha-Mo Parivar and expressed his gratitude for giving him a new lease of life.

Sri Ranjan Biswal, Advisor, Niramaya and our Jeevan Bindu coordinator (Cuttack city) was also present on the occasion.

Ensured Support For Further Studies

Muralidhar Behera, a resident of Berhampur was undergoing treatment at MKCG Berhampur since 8th January. Unfortunately, he breathed his last during the course of the treatment in the month of February. His wife had also expired few years back and left behind were 3 sons. Out of the three, 2 are working as daily wage labourers outside the state and the younger one is studying in a school in the village.

Upon getting information about the matter, through our helpdesk associate Girija Satpathy, stationed at the hospital, MLA Sri Bikram Panda and MP Sri Chandrasekhar Sahu reached at the hospital and made all required arrangements for the last rites of the deceased at the crematorium

and Girija coordinated the process. They also ensured to provide support for the further studies of the youngest son. This selfless act was appreciated by the people who witnessed the matter at the hospital.

Humanity Still Survives

Smitalin Barik, a resident of Bhubaneswar, works as a supervisor in Mo-Bus whereas her younger sister Monisalin is a student at B.J.E.M school. During the pandemic their father got affected and keeping the request of Monisalin, the school administration helped them financially for the treatment. But unfortunately, their father succumbed to the disease. After that, Smitalin started working in Mo-bus to support the family. But it was difficult for her to fulfill their needs and pay for her younger sister's education. The school fee was due for 2 to 3 years amounting to approximately 1.5 lakhs.

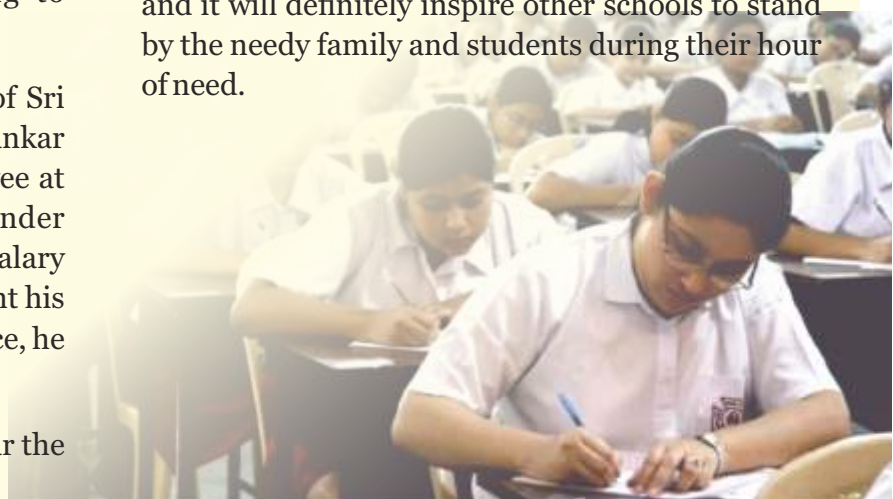
Similarly, Ms. Snehashree Sahoo, daughter of Sri Nabakumar Sahu, is a student at Gourishankar School, Bhubaneswar. Sri Sahu is an employee at the housing corporation bank but was under financial stress since he had not received his salary for the past 8-9 months. Recently, he had spent his savings on 2 major surgeries for his wife. Hence, he couldn't clear the dues at the school.

In both the cases, the family was asked to clear the

dues after which their wards could receive the admit card to appear for the 10th board examination.

Both the family approached Sri Rudra Samantary (Joint Secretary, Odisha-Mo Parivar) and immediate steps were taken by Dr. Satyajit Dash (Advisor) who discussed with the school authorities and both Monisalin and Snehashree received their admit card.

This merely describes that humanity still survives and it will definitely inspire other schools to stand by the needy family and students during their hour of need.



Kin Receives Voluntary Support

Abhiram Biswal, a 32-year-old resident of Balasore was working in a private ltd. company in Bangalore. On 17th February, he suddenly fell ill and his colleagues made arrangements to take him to the nearest government hospital where, unfortunately Abhiram breathed his last on the way.

Back at his native place, the bereaved family was shocked by the news of the untimely demise of their only son, who was the sole bread winner of the family. They had lost the hope of seeing their son for the last time. Abhiram's colleagues approached few Odia residents at Bangalore seeking help to transfer the mortal remains. The matter came into notice of few journalists who voluntarily came forward and made arrangements to shift the body via air from Bangalore to Bhubaneswar.

Immediately, Dr. Praharaj lent his helping hand for this family and required arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains from Bhubaneswar airport to their native place.

Odisha-Mo Parivar team stood by the family after the mortal remains reached at Balasore and the family expressed their gratitude for making it possible for them to see their son for the last time.



Logistical Support To Transfer Mortal Remains

Umakant Pradhan, a 30-year-old resident of Kadalipal, Deogarh had met with an accident and was admitted to Ashwini hospital, Bhubaneswar on 11th February.

Unfortunately, he lost his life during the course of the treatment. The family had approached Sri Durga Samantaray (Secretary Odisha-Mo Parivar) seeking help to transfer the mortal remains.

Upon getting the information, our helpdesk associate Sudarsan Sahoo, stationed at Capital hospital was intimated to stand by the family, since the body was shifted to Capital Hospital for post-mortem. Sudarsan helped the family in required assistance. Later, logistical arrangements were

54-year-old Sri Sahu was the only earning member of the family and was taking care of his wife all alone. On 14th February, he had gone to take bath outside the hospital premises and was hit by a vehicle while returning back to hospital.

Immediately he was admitted for treatment but unfortunately, he succumbed to his injuries.

The bereaved family approached our Jeevan Bindu coordinator Sri Ranjan Biswal seeking help to transfer the mortal remains. Sri Biswal stood by the family and made required arrangements in coordination with the Red Cross funds to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital to their native place at Balangir.

Rescued After Continuous

The family of Smt. Asima approached Odisha-Mo Parivar seeking help to rescue her and bring back the mortal remains to Puri, Swarg Dwar for the last rites since it was the last wish of the deceased.

The matter was immediately intimated to Odisha-Mo Parivar's SPOC at Gulf, Dr. Arun Praharaj. Dr. Praharaj relentlessly started coordinating with the Embassy and MoS, Foreign Affairs and due to his sincere efforts, Smt. Ranjit was safely repatriated, after getting her condoned from the legal cases.

Her flight was scheduled from Dubai to Odisha via Visakhapatnam. After reaching at Visakhapatnam international airport, our helpdesk associate at Visakhapatnam, Sri Prakash Behera stood by her and assisted in the required formalities at the airport. Further, logistical arrangements were made to transfer them to Puri, Swarg Dwar. Odisha-Mo Parivar team stood by the family members during the last rites.

This complicated case has been processed only because of the relentless effort of Dr. Arun Kumar Praharaj, who is an active social worker and despite facing various obstacles he always remains alerted to help the migrant Odia in distress.

Major Interventions By Helpdesk Associates

RARE BLOOD PROVIDED

Rashmi Rekha Rout, a 37-year-old resident of Kendrapada, was admitted to AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, suffering from rheumatoid arthritis and was on numerous medications.

A team of doctors evaluated the patient and planned for surgeries of both the hip and knee joints in one setting and this was the first ever quadruple joint replacement surgery in Odisha. Our helpdesk associate Somnath Swain helped in arranging rare B-ve blood for the patient required during the surgery and also maintained a follow-up with the patient till she got discharged.

Padmabati Santoshray, a 60-year-old from Koraput suffering from kidney related issue, was admitted to SLNMCH, Koraput.

During the course of the treatment there was an urgent need of rare O-ve blood for the patient. The family was unable to arrange the same and approached our helpdesk associate Baikuntha Mandal. Since, blood was not available at that moment at the hospital, Baikuntha contacted Sri Iswar Panigrahi (BJD District President) and he immediately sent his son Suman Panigrahi who donated blood for the patient.

Basantha Khillo, an 18-year-old resident of Koraput suffering from blood cancer was referred to Medcover Hospital, Visakhapatnam for treatment.

Our helpdesk associate Prakash Behera attended the patient and helped in admission and required documentation procedure for treatment under the BSKY scheme. The patient's attendant was under financial burden and was facing issues for having proper meal. Prakash got to know about this and immediately helped her with some funds with the help of few volunteers in the hospital.

Saraswati Gopal, a 65-year-old resident of Koksara, Kalahandi was detected with breast cancer and visited DHH Bhawanipatna for a check-up. Our helpdesk associate Himanshu Naik attended to the patient and helped her in getting a doctor's consultation followed by the required tests & medicines from the counter.

The patient was referred to a private hospital for further treatment and Himansu helped her in the required documentation process for her further treatment under the BSKY Scheme.

Babula Gouda, a 35-year-old resident of Berhampur had met with an accident suffering from cervical spine injury and was almost bed ridden.

He was unable to visit the hospital for the treatment since there was no male member in the family to assist him. One of their neighbors intimated this to MLA Sri Bikram Panda about the case. Upon getting the information, Sri Panda advised our helpdesk associate Girija Satpathy to look after the case. Immediately, Girija reached at Babula's residence and assured him that he would get proper treatment. The patient was entitled for treatment under the BSKY scheme and Girija helped in required documentation procedures and logistical arrangements were made to shift the patient from his residence to Medcover hospital, Visakhapatnam.

Padmini Munda, a 58-year-old resident of Sonepur suffering from fever, had visited VIMSAR, Burla for doctor's consultation.

There was no one to take care of her. Upon noticing her, our helpdesk associate Dhirendra Suna maintained a regular follow-up with her and helped in required assistance throughout the course of her treatment till she got discharged. She was not capable enough to make arrangements for her return to her native place. Dhirendra, with the help of few volunteers arranged funds and ensured safe return to her native place.

Unfortunately, he lost his life during the course of the treatment. Our helpdesk associate Smt. Rojalin Panda had attended the patient during the course of the treatment and after the demise she coordinated to transfer the mortal remains back from the hospital to their native place.

Naba Kishor Behera, a 40-year-old resident of Nilagiri, Balasore had consumed poison and was admitted to FMMCH, Balasore.

Our helpdesk associate Mrutyunjay Maharana helped him in getting emergency treatment, required tests and medical assistance. After consultation, the doctor advised to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack.

Mrutyunjay coordinated in making arrangements to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack for further treatment and intimated our helpdesk associates at Cuttack to look after the patient.

Abhimanyu Das, a book-binder from Cuttack, finds his happiness in serving poor and needy cancer patients at Acharya Harihar Regional Cancer Centre as well as other patients at the SCB Medical College & Hospital Cuttack. Rendering service such as navigation, providing blood, arranging meals



etc. to unknown, homeless and destitute people suffering from the deadly disease is his daily chore. Moreover, he also cremates the bodies that are unclaimed and unattended. A major shock in his life turned him to social service. In 2002 he faced a major accident.

He fought with death for several months. He was bedridden for around a year. His family lost its source of income. While fighting to survive, he learned the importance of life which is the greatest gift of the Almighty to us.

"My father always remained an inspiration to me for carrying out such works. Serving needy cancer patients got stronger as I lost many close relatives due to the deadly disease, including my mother, uncle and father-in-law. I initiated my efforts while attending my brother-in-law at the hospital, who was undergoing cancer treatment in 2009."



For many cancer patients, he is an angel in disguise. Since then he has never looked back in his path of social service. People from all around have started extending a helping hand to him. His selfless service has been recognized and praised by several dignitaries of the country. He has also received several awards for his selfless service, including the Odisha Citizen's Award—the highest civilian award in the state.

He is lovingly called Abhi Bhai by all and he has decided to spend the rest of his life in service of cancer patients.

Pratap Kumar Jena, a 39-year-old resident from Jagatsinghpur was in Bhubaneswar in the year 1997 to attend the last rites of Late Shri Biju Patnaik but while returning back to his home he got hit by a bus where he got severely injured and was taken to SCB, Cuttack where he had to undergo a surgery on his right leg. Unfortunately, his leg was amputated as per the doctor's advice. He had opted for a prosthetic from Olatpur, which got damaged.

Upon getting information, Sri Rudra Samantray, Joint Secretary (Odisha-Mo Parivar) intimated him about provision of prosthetics at ARC Capital hospital and he was guided for measurements at the hospital. After receiving prosthetics he expressed his gratitude for the same.

3. Amar Beura

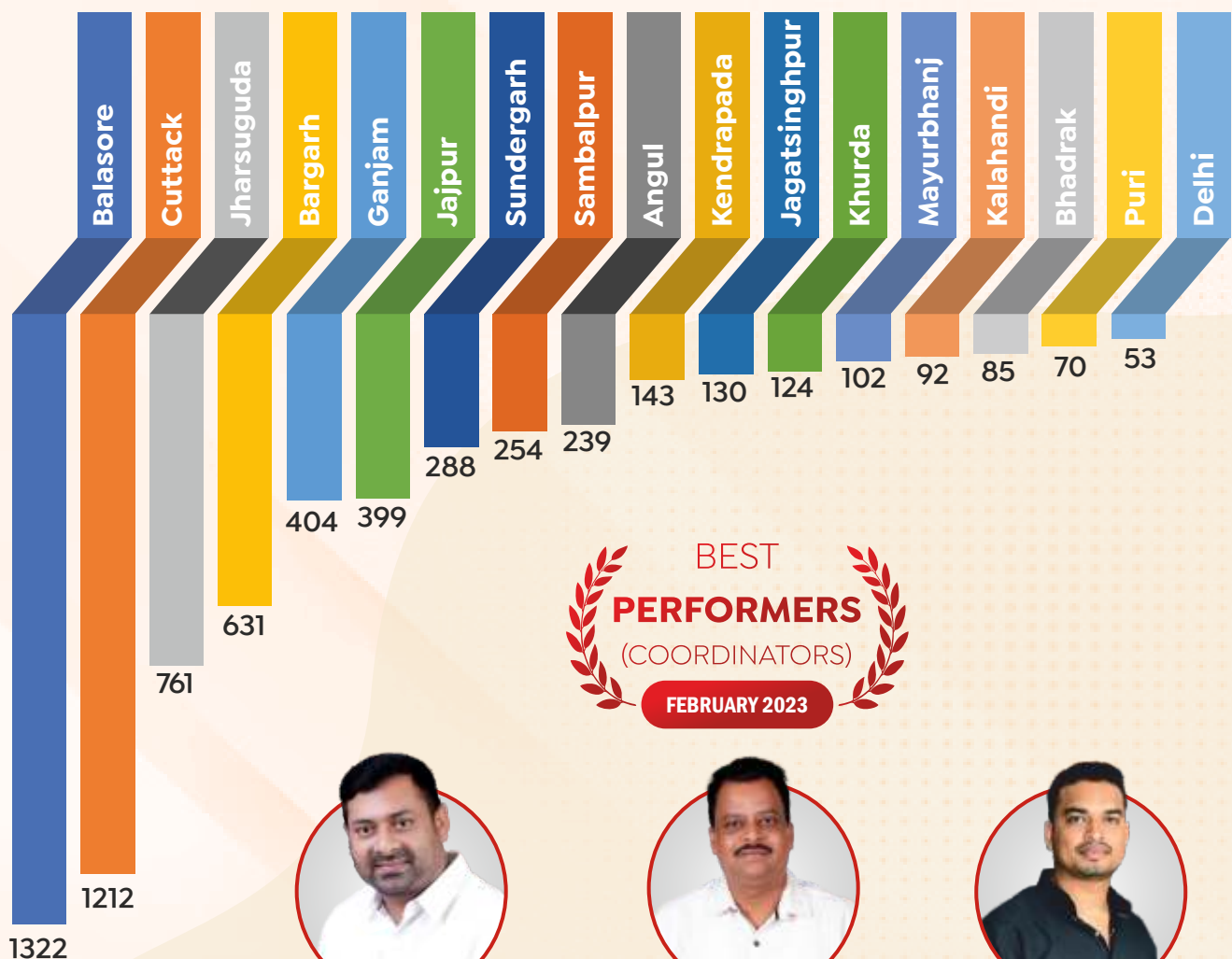
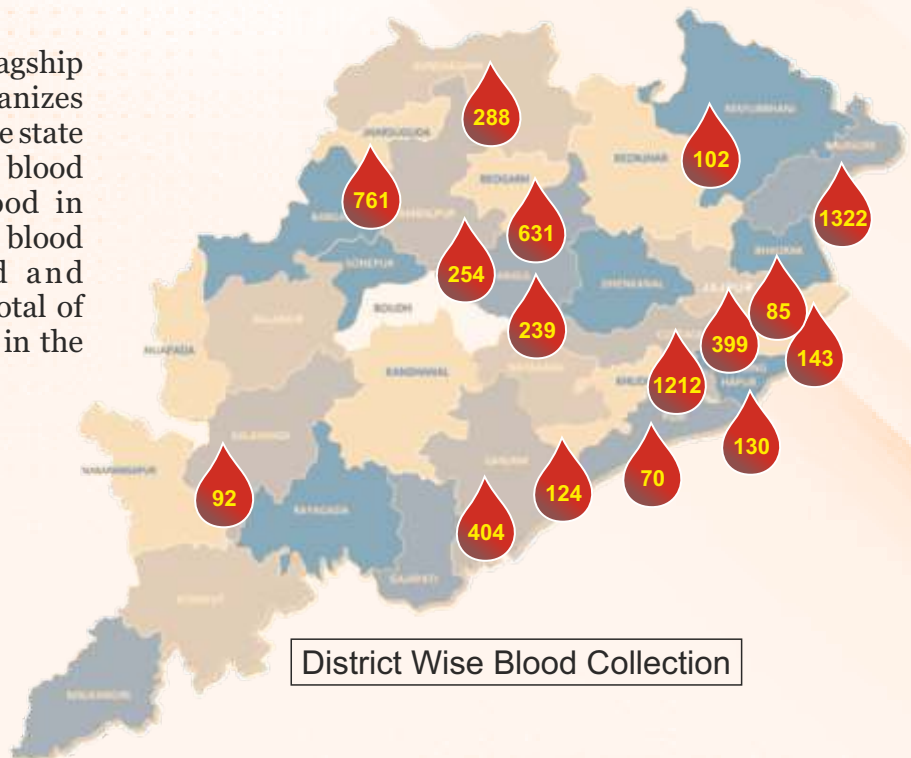

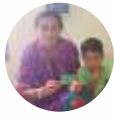
