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# Damayanti's Legacy: Inspiring Hope Through Organ Donation

**D**amayanti Mahanta, a class 9 student from Keonjhar, was suffering from chronic kidney disease. She was undergoing dialysis for the last few months. Meanwhile, she suffered a brain stroke and was admitted to AIIMS, Bhubaneswar. She gradually went into a coma state and was put on a life-support ventilator.

As she showed no sign of recovery, the expert committee after a thorough assessment, declared her brain dead.

Upon getting to know about Damayanti, our helpdesk associate Somanath Swain reached out to the family. Learning about the importance of organ donation, Damayanti's parents took a remarkable decision to donate her organs for the great cause of saving someone else's precious life. After receiving the consent from the parents, a team of eminent surgeons successfully retrieved Damayanti's liver which was airlifted to a hospital in New Delhi through a green corridor.

Dr Satyajit Dash, health advisor, Odisha-Mo Parivar reached at AIIMS to console the family members.

"Damayanti is no longer with us, but her soul lives on through the gift of life she gave to others. We request everyone to donate organs and help save precious lives," pleaded Damayanti's parents as they tearfully bid farewell to their daughter.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik had earlier declared that the last rites of organ donors will be performed with state honours in recognition of their sacrifice and bravery.

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# Tarakant Rescued After 7 Years

**T**arakant Mallick, a 42-year-old resident of Kendrapada, at the instigation of an agent, went to Malaysia 7 years ago to earn more money and to secure a better future of his three daughters and family. However, things took a bad turn as he faced low pay, along with physical and mental abuse.

The distressed family approached Odisha-Mo Parivar seeking help to rescue Tarakant at the earliest.

Upon getting information, immediate action was taken and the matter was discussed with Sri Sanjay Dalai, Founder, Global Odia Volunteers. It was revealed that despite continuous requests, Tarakant's valid Visa was not processed, leaving him stranded.

The matter was escalated to

legal issues were addressed to facilitate the transfer of the mortal remains from Bangalore to Bhubaneswar airport.

Both Odisha-Mo Parivar and Odisha Paribar team reached at the airport to receive the body and required arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains from the airport to the deceased's native place at Kendrapada.

**B**rundaban Sahu, a 56-year-old resident of Ganjam suffering from ENT issues, was referred to Medicover Hospital, Visakhapatnam.

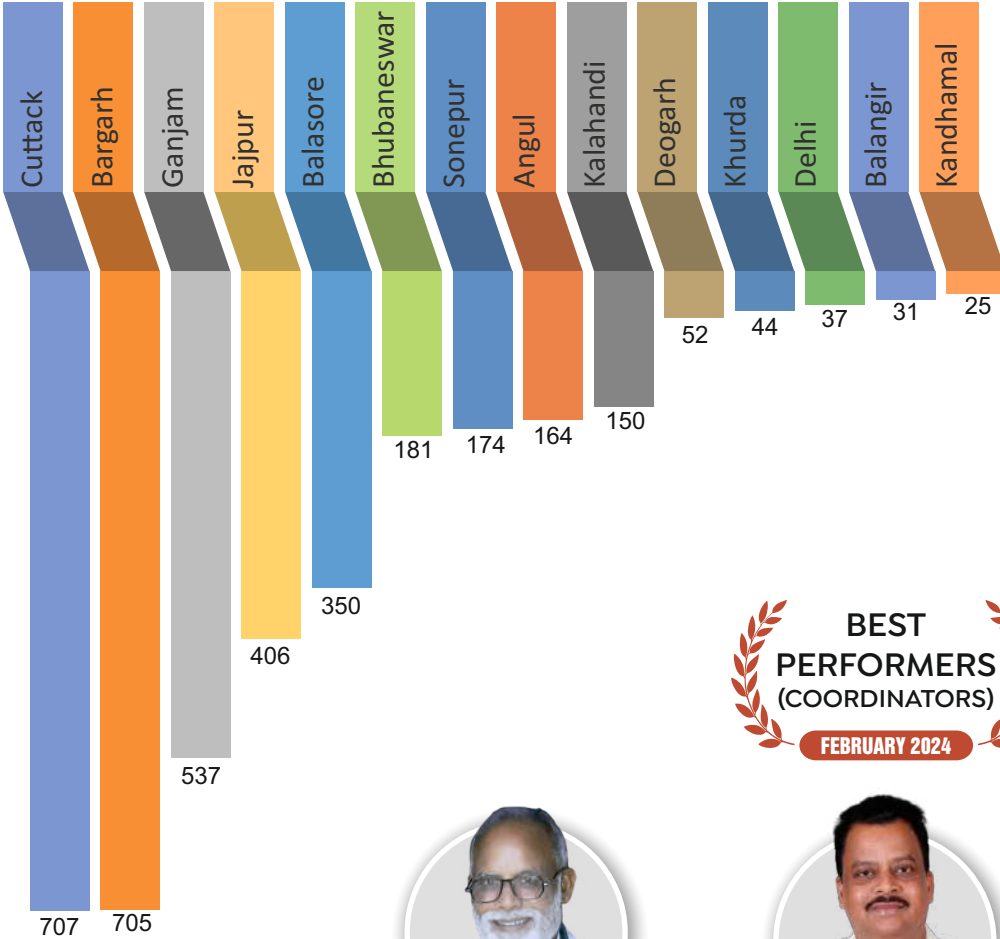
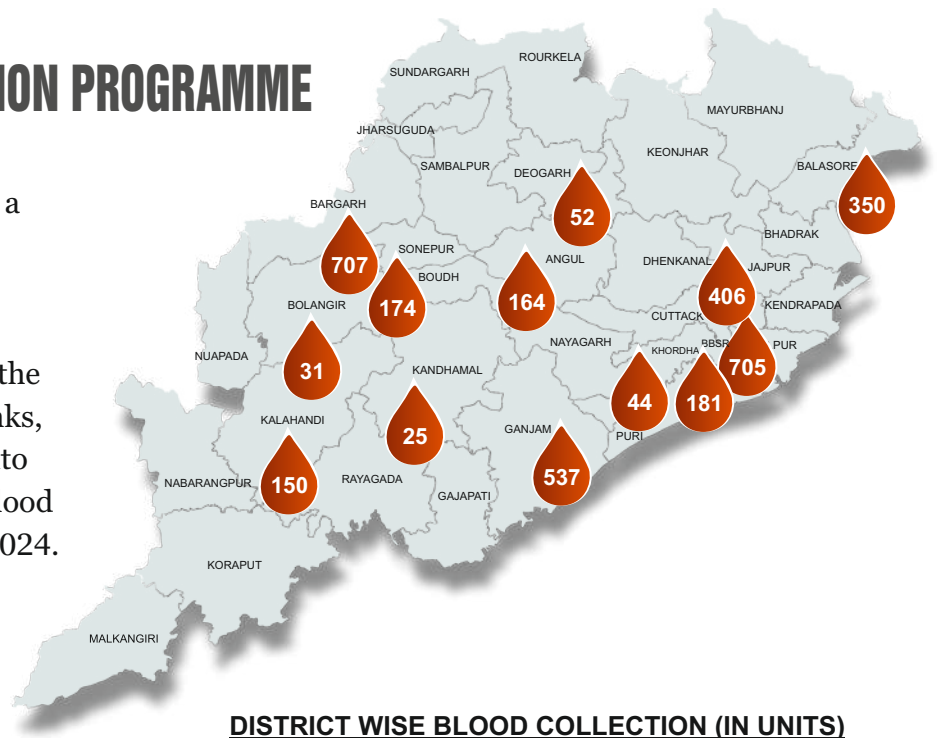

## ODISHA-MO PARIVAR'S CANCER CARE INTERVENTIONS

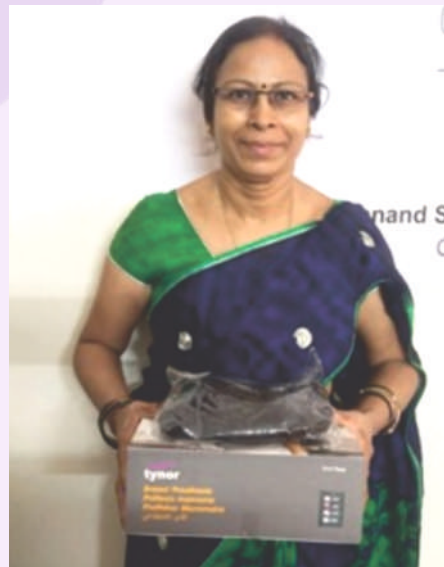

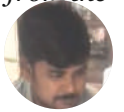
