Blood Collection through Jeevan Bindu Programme



To commemorate the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, a month-long social activities were conducted throughout the state, giving priority to Jeevan Bindu programme starting from 2nd October to 2nd November under the guidance of Honourable Chief Minister.

Odisha - Mo Parivar targeted 20,000 Units of blood, doubling up its monthly target of 10,000 Units, for this period. Also during this period, on the occasion of Hon'ble Chief Minister's birthday, at his behest, mega camps were scheduled throughout the state.

As a result 23,170 units were collected in one month, which is an all-time record in regards to blood collected in a single month.

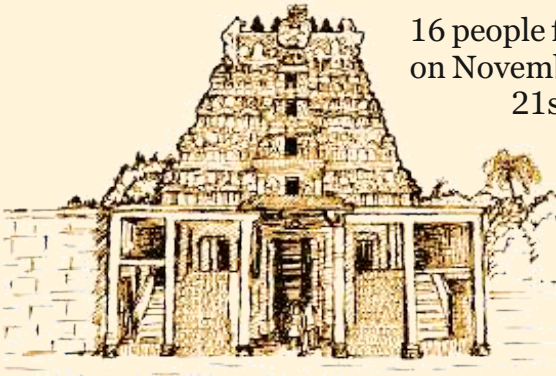

Flood-hit Pilgrims Rescued From Chennai



16 people from Odisha, had been to Rameshwaram and Kanyakumari on November 14th on a pilgrim. The return journey was scheduled on 21st November.

Unfortunately, due to heavy floods at Andhra Pradesh all the trains were cancelled. Many found themselves stranded at the railway station in a helpless situation with no food and no place to stay. Out of the 16 people, majority were elderly women and children.

One of the returnees, Niharika Dash initially contacted Hon'ble Minister, Tourism and Culture Sri Jyoti Prakash Panigrahi, who further intimated her to contact Odisha-Mo Parivar. She then contacted the Convenor, Odisha-Mo Parivar and informed about the problems they were facing.

The matter was immediately taken into consideration and the SPOC (single point of contact) members Sri Khirod Jena & Sri Panchana Jena, stationed at Chennai, shifted those 16 people to a safe location at Chennai.



The SPOC members ensured safe stay and proper food for them at Chennai. The next day i.e. on 22nd November, due to unavailability of air tickets, eight of them were brought back to Odisha and on 23rd November, arrangements were made to bring back the remaining eight people. Berhampur MLA and In-Charge (Odisha-Mo Parivar) Sri Bikram Panda, Bhubaneswar North MLA and Odisha-Mo Parivar Member Sri Susant Rout along with Odisha-Mo Parivar team received them at the Bhubaneswar Airport and ensured their safe return to their native places. The entire process was swiftly coordinated by Joint Secretary (Odisha-Mo Parivar) Sri Rudra Narayan Samantaray.

Activities under the aegis of Odisha-Mo Parivar

1 BSKY Card for treatment

Pratikshya Priyadarshini Sahoo, a 11-year-old resident of Balughat, Puri is suffering from severe diabetes and one of the kidney is also affected. At present she is under treatment at SCBMCH and she along with her parents are staying in a rented house at Cuttack, for her treatment purpose only. Jeevan Bindu Cuttack-city coordinator Sri Ranjan Biswal and Puri joint coordinator Sri Stalin Parija stepped in, got her BSKY card and provided financial assistance for her further treatment. A physiotherapist was also assigned for her as per the Doctor's advice.

2 Last Rites Of An Unattended Person

Under the vertical "Cremation of Unattended deceased" Odisha-Mo Parivar steps in to give a respectful send-off to the unclaimed and unattended mortal remains, identified by the stakeholders. In the month of November, Biju Yuva Janata Dal State working president Sri Suvendu Mangaraj, under the aegis of Odisha-Mo Parivar ensured timely cremation of an unidentified body at ITI crematorium in Balasore, which was left unattended at DHH, Balasore.

Mortal remains brought back from Gujarat

A 21-year-old boy Dinabandhu Reddy of Ganjam District, was working as a daily labourer in Surat, Gujarat for the last 2 years.

On 20th October, he fell ill and was admitted to a private hospital at Gujarat but unfortunately lost his life on 31st October.

The family were helpless and seeking help to bring back the mortal remains.

Odisha-Mo Parivar upon getting the information, made logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from Gujarat to Ganjam and also assisted in conducting the last rites.

Chandramohan Rao, a 74-year-old elderly man of Madhusudan Nagar, Bhubaneswar breathed his last on 10th November.

His elderly wife was alone at home and was completely helpless as she had no clue how to proceed with the funeral activities.

Odisha-Mo Parivar upon getting the information regarding the same, immediately reached the location and ensured dignified cremation of the deceased & also provided financial assistance to his wife.

Naba Kishore Rout (52) of Kalahandi district suffering from brain stroke, was admitted to SCB, Cuttack.

Unfortunately, he breathed his last while undergoing treatment. The deceased's family were under financial stress and reached out to our helpdesk associate for financial help.

Upon getting the information, Odisha-Mo Parivar made logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital to their native and our helpdesk associates Sandeep & Santosh coordinated the same.

Bhagaban Pradhan a resident of Sanakhemundi, Ganjam was working at a saree weaving company in Kotora, Gujarat. He was in good health on 27th November and even had dinner with his co-workers and talked through video call before sleeping. On the morning of 28th November he did not respond to his co-workers calls and later it was found out that he had passed away. The deceased's family reached out to Odisha-Mo Parivar seeking help to bring back the mortal remains.

Upon getting the information, arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains from Gujarat to his native place at Sanakhemundi, Ganjam.

Odisha-Mo Parivar ensured dignified departure of an unattended deceased on 12th November. Upon getting the information regarding an unattended body at Salia Sahi Basti, Odisha-Mo Parivar Member Smt Bharti Singh along with the Odisha-Mo Parivar team immediately reached at the location and made all necessary arrangements to transfer the mortal remains of 52-year-old deceased woman Parbati Singh to Satya Nagar cremation ground for the last rites.

Prosthetics by Odisha-Mo Parivar

Pramod Baral, a 55-year-old man from Astaranga, Puri district, sustained an injury in his leg three years back, which turned septic and later he was also diagnosed with bone cancer. His leg was amputated on the advice of the doctor. Upon getting the information, Odisha Mo Parivar Health Advisor, Dr. Satyajit Dash and Odisha-Mo Parivar team made all necessary arrangements through Capital Hospital and S.S.E.P.D (Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities) to provide artificial limb to Pramod. Sri Pramod has been successfully provided with an artificial limb and expressed his gratitude towards the selfless service of Odisha Mo Parivar.

MAJOR INTERVENTIONS BY HELPDESK COORDINATORS

1. HELPED WITH RARE BLOOD GROUP

Halima Bibi, a 41-year-old blood cancer patient, was admitted to a private hospital at Cuttack.

There was need of the rare A-ve blood for the patient, which was arranged by our helpdesk associate Sandeep.

Mayadhar Nanda, an 80-year-old person from Kendrapada, suffering from kidney related issue was admitted to Capital Hospital, Bhubaneswar.

There was a need of rare AB+ve blood during his treatment, which was arranged by our helpdesk associate Bikash Behera.

Indira Sahu, a 45-year-old woman, admitted to MKCG, Berhampur, was diagnosed with low hemoglobin.

Our helpdesk associate Girija upon getting the information, helped the attendant of the patient in all required medical assistance and also arranged one unit of rare AB+ve blood required during treatment.

A new born child of Kunal Sahoo of Nuapada district was suffering from low hemoglobin and was advised by the doctor for an immediate blood transfusion. Since the blood was rare B-ve, it was difficult for the family to arrange the same.

Upon getting information, regarding the situation, our helpdesk associate Rojalin immediately arranged one B-ve donor for the patient.

An Anemic patient Sujata Sahu (23) was in urgent need of rare A-ve blood for her treatment who was admitted to MKCG, Berhampur.

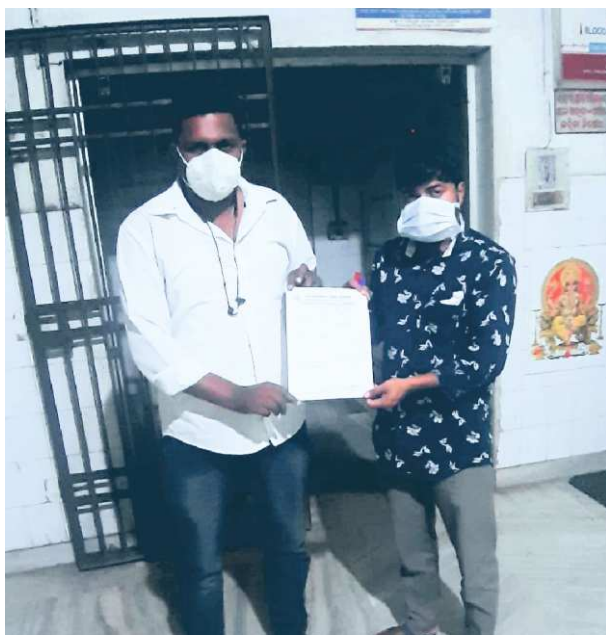
Our helpdesk associate Girija Satpathy, immediately arranged the required units and ensured proper treatment for the patient.

Sumanta Mohanty, a 55-year-old blood Cancer patient of Balasore district was admitted to a private hospital at Cuttack.

There was need of the rare O-ve blood for the patient, which was difficult at the end of the family to arrange. Upon getting the information our helpdesk associate Sandeep arranged one unit of blood for the patient.

Sukru Bibhar, a 70-year-old person from Bargarh was admitted to VIMSAR, Burla for his leg surgery.

There was need of rare O-ve blood during the surgery, which was arranged by our helpdesk associate Dharendra, who also assisted the patient & his attendant in all required medical procedures.

2. GOING THE EXTRA MILE...

A person with severe infection in his hand, owing to some injury, was rescued by Odisha-Mo Parivar helpdesk associate Sandeep Rath. He not only reached the location but also brought the patient to the hospital. Helpdesk associates Sandeep and Santosh ensured proper health check-up. The person is currently at the destitute ward and a regular follow-up is being maintained.

Ramchandra Hansda of Mayurbhanj district was admitted to PRMMCH, Baripada for his hernia surgery.

There were no attendant for the patient, hence our helpdesk associate Asish helped in all required assistance starting from admission, followed by surgery till his discharge from the hospital.

Later on he re-united the patient with his family, after getting contact details from a paper found in the patient's pocket.



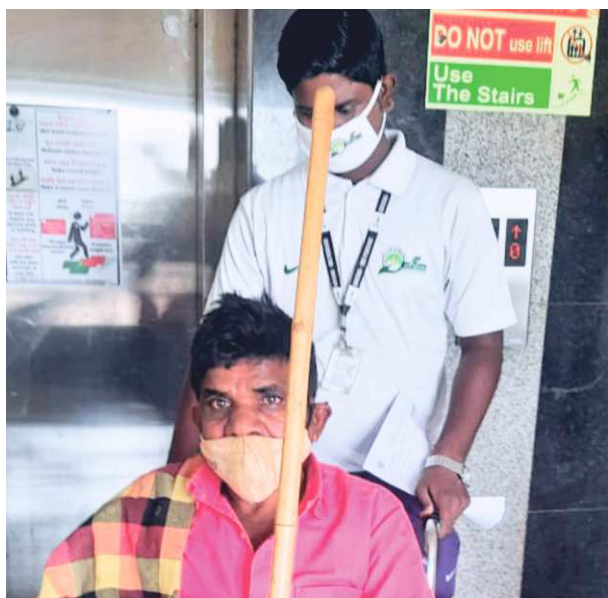

3. LOGISTICAL ARRANGEMENTS

Syamabandhu Patra, a 55-year-old person of Nayagarh, reached at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar with certain orthopedic issues. Due to unavailability of bed at the hospital, the doctor advised to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack.

Helpdesk associate Somnath coordinated with helpdesk associate Sandeep at SCB, Cuttack and made logistical arrangements to shift the patient to SCB.

Manoranjan Giri (35) of Mayurbhanj district suffering from hypervolemia was admitted to PRMMCH, Baripada.

The doctor advised to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack for better treatment. Our helpdesk associate Asish had been maintaining a follow-up with the patient and also made logistical arrangements to shift the patient from PRMMCH to SCB, Cuttack.

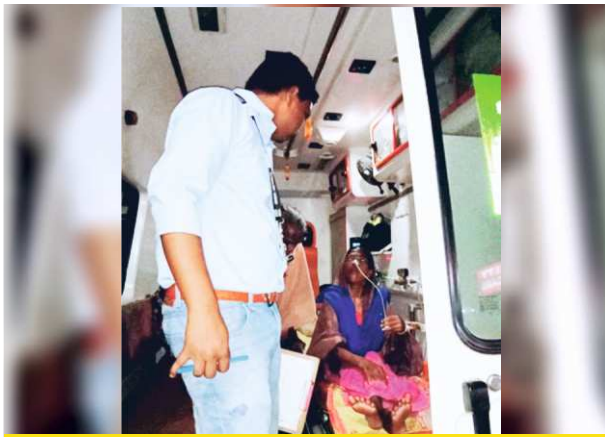
Helpdesk associate Dharendra had been maintaining a regular follow-up with the patient and after her demise, he made logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains back to her native place.

Umasankar Pradhan (50) of Koraput district was admitted to SLNMCH suffering from kidney related issues but unfortunately breathed his last while undergoing treatment.

Our helpdesk associate Baikuntha had been maintaining a follow-up with the patient while he was under treatment and also made logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from the hospital to his native place.

Golabati Deep (45) of Bargarh district suffering from mouth cancer, had been to VIMSAR, Burla for doctor's consultation.

The doctor advised to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack for further treatment. Our helpdesk associate Dharendra helped in assisting the patient to get doctor's consultation and later made logistical arrangements to shift the patient to SCB, Cuttack.

Our helpdesk associate Dharendra Suna rescued an abandoned differently-abled youth, who was found roaming near VIMSAR, Burla. The youth was facilitated with a complete health check-up and provided with food. Later, an application was issued to the District Social Security Officer to provide necessary shelter home to the youth and logistical arrangement was made to shift the boy to the shelter home. Presently the youth is being taken care at the shelter home.

4. TREATMENT UNDER BSKY

Abhaya Charan Nayak (65) suffering from brain stroke was initially admitted to SUM Hospital. Later as per doctor's advice he was shifted to KIIMS Hospital for better treatment.

Our helpdesk associate Siba had helped in all required medical procedures at SUM. He also helped the patient to get treatment at KIIMS under the BSKY Scheme. But unfortunately the patient lost his life while undergoing treatment and our helpdesk associate also made logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from KIIMS hospital to their home.

Debraj Panda(56), a resident of Bhubaneswar was admitted to SUM Hospital for his leg surgery.

Our helpdesk associate Siba Prasad Rout maintained a regular follow-up with the patient and registered him under the BSKY scheme for his treatment.

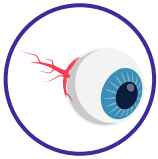
ORGAN DONATION

What is organ donation?

Organ donation is the entire practice of retrieving a human organ from a living or deceased person, who is referred to as a Donor, and transplanting it into a recipient. The recipient will be a patient who is suffering from organ failure and who will not survive unless she/he receives an organ replacement. The process of recovering organs is called Retrieval.

Which Organs Can Be Donated?

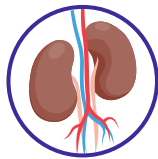
There are eight organs that can be donated and transplanted by a person after death and while the person is still alive.



Eyes

Eyes donated by one person provides the gift of vision to two blind persons. Eyes can be donated only after death. Spectacle wearers, those suffering from diabetes, hypertension, etc, those who have undergone cataract surgery can also donate eyes.

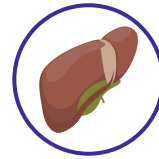
Time Frame between recovery and transplant: Cornea - 48 hours



Kidneys

Both kidneys can be donated by a deceased donor. Of all organs in the human body, the demand for kidneys is the highest and kidneys are the most frequently donated organs. A living donor can easily donate one kidney to someone and function well for the rest of their lives.

Time Frame between recovery and transplant: 24 to 48 hours



Liver

A donated liver from someone who has died (a deceased donor) can further be split into two pieces and transplanted into two different people to save their lives. A living donor can have a portion of her/his liver removed to donate to someone, and the remaining portion will regenerate to almost its full previous size.

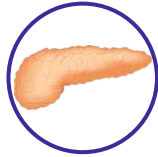
Time Frame between recovery and transplant: 12 to 16 hours



Heart

A heart is a muscular organ which pumps blood through the human body. In a person's life, the heart will beat around 2.5 billion times on average and keep the blood running in the body.

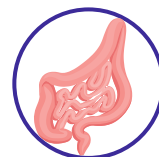
Time Frame between recovery and transplant: 4 to 6 hours



Pancreas

A deceased donor pancreas can be transplanted into an ailing patient. A living donor can also donate a portion of the pancreas and still retain pancreas functionality.

Time Frame between recovery and transplant: 6 hours



Intestine

After death, a donor can donate their intestine. Although quite rare, a living donor can donate a portion of the intestine.

Time Frame between recovery and transplant: 4 to 6 hours

Who Can Donate?

Living Donor: Any person not less than 18 years of age, who voluntarily authorizes the removal of any of his organ and/or tissue, during his or her lifetime, as per prevalent medical practices for therapeutic purposes.

Deceased Donor: Anyone, regardless of age, race or gender can become an organ and tissue donor after his or her Death (Brainstem/Cardiac). Consent of near relative or a person in lawful possession of the dead body is required. If the deceased donor is under the age of 18 years, then the consent required from one of the parent or any near relative authorized by the parents is essential. Medical suitability for donation is determined at the time of death.

Berhampur: Sixteen people from Odisha, majority of them from Ganjam district, who got stranded in Rameshwaram after their train to the state cancelled due to heavy floods in Andhra Pradesh, have been rescued by the Odisha Mo Parivar.

Eight of the rescued people, including two children and four women, reached the Bhubaneswar airport on Monday, while others are scheduled to reach on Tuesday. The other rescued persons are staying at a temple in Chennai. They could not return on Monday due to non-availability of flight tickets. The Odisha Mo Parivar members are taking care of them," said Panda.

Niharika Dash, one of the returnees, said they had gone to Rameshwaram and Kanyakumari on November 14 on a trip. Their return journey was scheduled from Rameshwaram on Sunday.

"We got worried when we came to know that the train to Odisha got cancelled due to the floods in Andhra Pradesh. However, we managed to contact the Odisha Mo Parivar. Their members took us to Chennai on Sunday night and arranged our return journey to home. We thank chief minister Naveen Patnaik and his team of the Odisha Mo Parivar for the timely help," Dash added.

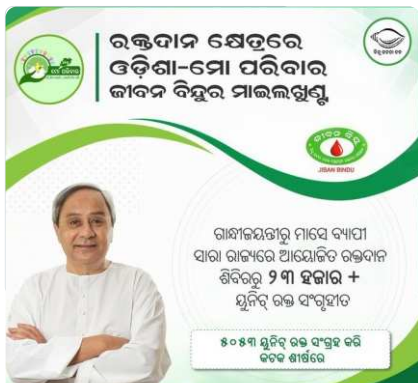

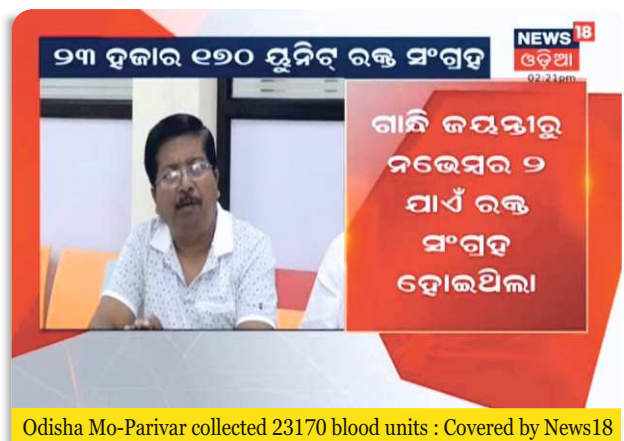
