Upon investigation, it was found that his VISA and passport were canceled by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) of Saudi Arabia.





On 3rd June, a team of 10 members from Bhubaneswar was immediately directed to rush to Balasore and assist the victims and their families, who without any delay started their journey with Sri Rudra Samantary (Joint secretary) and a helpdesk was immediately set up inside DHH Balasore to assist the families to locate their wards.

## Heart Wrenching Experience of our volunteers..



On the day of the accident at around 9 PM, I heard that many people were injured and dead. The next day, we went out on the order of our Hon'ble Convener. On reaching NOCCI Business Park, we found a large amount of dead bodies being shifted. Dead bodies were being brought to NOCCI through trucks and BMC workers were helping to bring them down from the trucks. There was so much bad odour at that time but I didn't care about it and helped to move the dead bodies off the truck. That was the most nightmarish experience seeing the dead bodies. I felt very sad but I stuck to my duty.

One thing I learned from my working days in Odisha-mo parivar is that when people need help from our organization, we help them regardless of day, night or rain . In this case I always keep myself ready. When this fatal accident happened on 2nd June , many innocent people lost their lives. On 4th June, we went to Bahanaga, Balasore as per the Convenor's instructions. The situation there was very heartbreaking. It is not easy for me to describe the plight of thousands of injured. My eyes were full of tear during the moment of identification of dead bodies in coordination with BMC. I consider myself blessed because I was able to serve the people through Odisha- Mo Parivar. For the first time in my life I saw such a big accident which was very painful. However, I thank God and Odisha-Mo parivar, who gave me the opportunity to serve the distressed people. Finally, a prayer from my side, may God give patience and strength to the bereaved family and speedy recovery to the injured.

The train accident on June 2 was very heartbreaking. At first, I did not think that the accident would be so big. As time went by, I got the news of many people dead and thousands injured. We left on June 3 on the orders of the office. It was very sad moment to view the horrible situation where families of the deceased were rushing to identify the dead bodies. We were there for 2-days helping the people who could not find their relatives. A list of the injured came from the hospital which helped people a lot in finding their relatives. Also, we gave them some fruits and drinks as they were not in a condition to eat or drink anything. I saw such a big train accident for the first time in my life. I feel grateful that I have been able to serve people to some extent in this accident.




