Odisha-Mo Parivar Collected 2 lakhs blood units in just 20 months



Odisha-Mo Parivar through its flagship program Jeevan Bindu achieved a milestone of collecting 2 Lakh Blood Units through its blood donation Camps organized across the state.

Since the incorporation of Jeevan Bindu program under the patronage of Odisha-Mo Parivar on 9th August 2020, the aim was to collect 1 Lakh Blood Units in a year but it was achieved in just 10 months on 6th June 2021. Odisha-Mo Parivar always makes effort to conduct blood donation camps throughout the State, thus saving precious lives and maintaining adequate stock at all the 56 blood banks.

It has again made an achievement by collecting another 1 lac unit in another 10 months, i.e a total of 2 lac units in just 20 months.

Exemplary Blood Donation Camps by Odisha-Mo Parivar

On 17th April 2022, Odisha-Mo Parivar through its flagship program Jeevan Bindu, conducted state wide blood donation camps as a tribute to the great leader Late Shri Biju Patnaik. The Blood donation camps were conducted at several districts of Odisha.

The camps showed people's love and respect for the Iron Man of Odisha. At some areas, phase wise blood donation camps were conducted i.e., day and night camps. People came in huge numbers to donate blood and a

record number of 10,063 units of blood was collected in a single day.

Ganjam collected 2202 units which was the highest among all the districts, followed by Cuttack and Balasore with 959 & 933 respectively.

Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha, Shri Naveen Patnaik also congratulated Odisha-Mo Parivar, Jeevan Bindu Coordinators on the achievement via a tweet. Odisha-Mo Parivar, on the same day also crossed the mark of 2,00,000 units of blood in just 20 months.

In the month of April, Odisha-Mo Parivar-Jeevan Bindu Balasore Coordinator Sri Suvendu Das Mangaraj ensured timely cremation of four unidentified bodies lying at the ITI Crematorium in Balasore, which were left unattended at the DHH Balasore for couple of days.

Balaram Sahu, a resident of Puri was travelling from Surat to his native place at Puri. Unfortunately, on the way near Bhusawal railway station he breathed his last due to heart attack. The mortal remains were taken to nearby hospital at Jalgaon by the GRP and the family were informed about the demise.

The bereaved family approached Shri Sanjay Das Burma, Deputy Chairman, State Planning board, seeking help to bring back the mortal remains. Shri Burma intimated the matter to Convener of Odisha-Mo Parivar and immediately steps were taken up and required arrangements were made to expedite the process to bring back the mortal remains of Balaram Sahu from Jalgaon to their native place at Puri.

Eye Donation in coordination with Odisha-Mo Parivar

76-year-old Bijayram Jena was undergoing treatment at a private hospital in Bhubaneswar but unfortunately breathed his last on April 1 due to a brain stroke. This matter came to the notice of Sri Sangram Keshari Paikray, Chairman, Khadi Board, who had a conversation with the bereaved family regarding eye donation.

Upon counseling, the family agreed to donate the eyes of the deceased and Sri Paikray intimated the matter to Odisha-Mo Parivar. All the required procedures were coordinated by our helpdesk associate Bikash Behera, stationed at Capital Hospital, Bhubaneswar.

Odisha-Mo Parivar brings back mortal ...

The matter came to the notice of Odisha-Mo Parivar and was escalated to the representative of Odisha-Mo Parivar in Bahrain, Dr. Arun Kumar Praharaj who immediately spoke to Dr. Aman Puri, Consul General of India, Dubai as well as the company where Shaikh Sajid was employed.

Due to his intervention and persuasion, the post-mortem and police clearance was expedited. Sri Praharaj also helped in the despatch of the mortal remains through air from Dubai to Odisha. Odisha-Mo Parivar team received the mortal remains at Biju Patnaik International Airport.

Thereafter, the mortal remains were transferred to Kendrapada and MLA Sri Sashi Bhusan Behera stood by the family members during the last rites.

Logistical arrangements made to transfer mortal remains

80-year-old Parbati Bhuyan from Jatani, Khurda was undergoing treatment at S.C.B. Medical College and Hospital, Cuttack since 3rd April but unfortunately breathed her last on 9th April due to brain stroke.

Our help desk associates Shri. Santosh Das & Sandeep Rath stationed at SCB Hospital, Cuttack helped the family in all required assistance. Since, the family was under financial stress, they approached Odisha-Mo Parivar seeking logistical help. Subsequently, arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains from SCB Cuttack to their native place at Jatani.

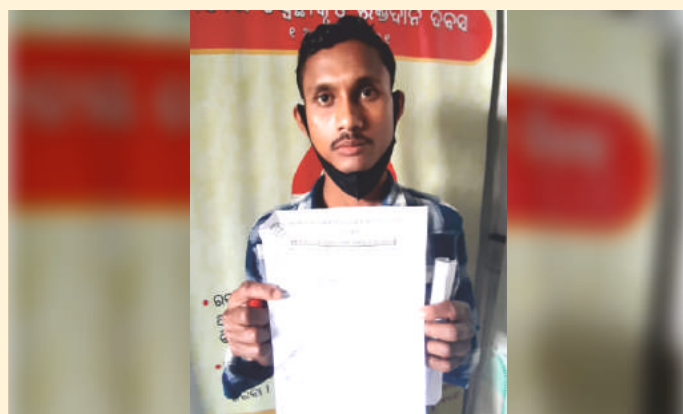

- 3** // Debakanta Khatua, a 45-year-old resident of Jajpur met with an accident and was admitted to Capital Hospital, Bhubaneswar.

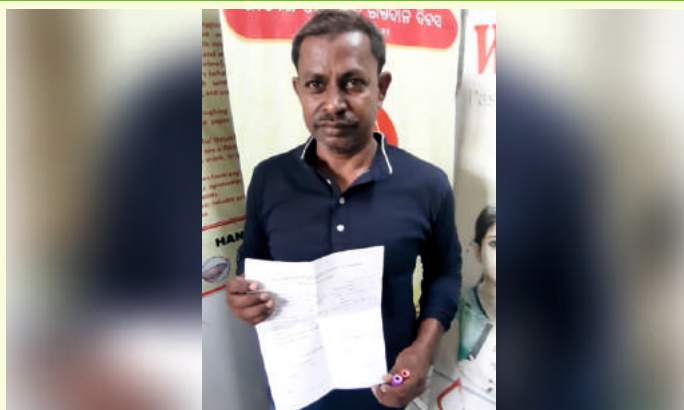

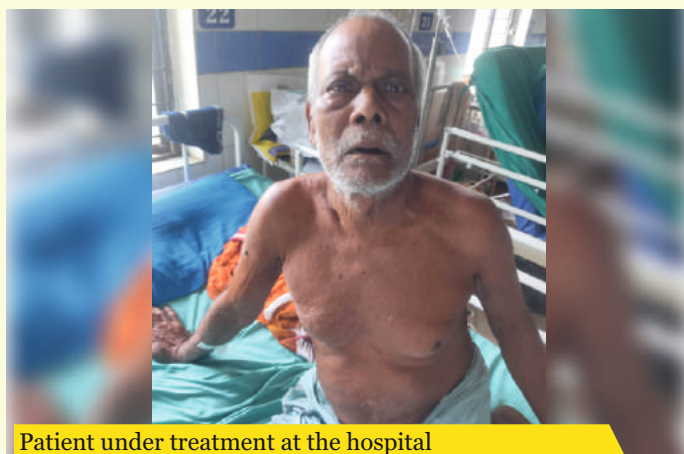
6 // Chanchal Das, a 76-year-old resident of Cuttack was admitted to SCB, Cuttack for treatment.

“It takes nothing away from a human to be kind to an animal. Rescuing and caring these speechless creatures is what I love to do”

These are the words of 30-year-old youth, Krishna Nayak, a physiotherapist by profession who has dedicated his life towards the wellbeing of stray animals. A resident of Bhubaneswar, who pursued his education in Ludhiana, Krishna had been on a tour to Vrindavan 3 years ago. That tour turned out to be a defining moment in his life. On his way, he saw a cow who had met with an accident. Looking at the suffering of the cow, he immediately swung into action.

With the help of few local residents, he rescued the cow and took care of her until she was completely recovered. Since then, he decided to



dedicate his life for the care of those speechless animals. After returning to Odisha, he continued with this noble work. His selfless service has been an inspiration for all and many other like-minded people have joined him. At least 2500 people are working with Krishna in Bhubaneswar and around 18,000 people throughout the state, inspired by his noble work.

“Look at the innocent eyes of the speechless beings, they also deserve to live happily. We live in a society and we have a duty towards it”. This is what Krishna keeps on explaining to everyone around him and thus many people come forward to help him with raw materials, food and other supplements required for rescue and care of those stray animals. Krishna with the help of his teams, installed water tanks at various places for those stray animals. They also urge the people not to discard plastic waste in open areas accessible to stray animals, so that it doesn't get consumed by them leading to major health hazards.

After receiving the prosthetics, Khirod expressed his gratitude towards Odisha-Mo Parivar for coordinating in the process.

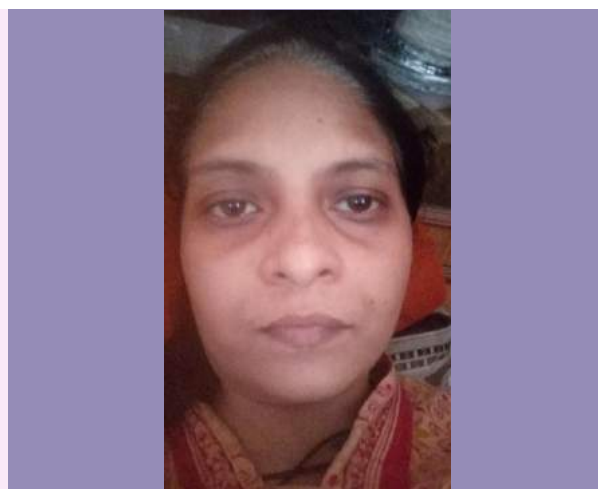


