Arrival Of Mortal Remains From Mumbai And Transferring To Ganjam

Sidhant Sahu(26), a resident of Jhadankuli, Ganjam was working at Mumbai. While working at the site, he met with an accident and breathed his last on the spot. The company made arrangements to transfer the mortal remains from Mumbai to Bhubaneswar via air.

Narayan Sahu, brother of the deceased was supposed to travel in the same flight but somehow due to delay in formalities couldn't board the flight on time. He approached Dr. Gopabandhu Dash, requesting to coordinate the process of receiving the mortal remains and help in making logistical arrangements to transfer the mortal remains.

Upon getting the information from Dr. Dash, Odisha-Mo Parivar team reached the airport and after completing the required formalities, received the mortal remains which was kept safely in their custody till Narayan reached Bhubaneswar in the next flight. After he reached, the body was handed over to him and logistical arrangements were made

to transfer the mortal remains from the airport to their native place at Ganjam.

Narayan and his family members expressed their gratitude for helping them in the required formalities and standing by them during their difficult times.

Dignified Cremation Of Unattended Bodies By Odisha-Mo Parivar

In the month of September, a body of an elderly man was found by the local police, under a tree at Chatrama, Khordha which was kept in the mortuary for more than 96 hours. It was intimated in the media but no one came forward to claim the body. Upon getting the information about the case, our Jeevan Bindu coordinator Shri Dilip Hota along with his team stepped in to ensure the dignified cremation of the unattended body.

2 Saibani Panigrahi, an 80-year-old resident of Sriramnagar, Berhampur breathed her last on 21st September. For hours together, nobody approached to conduct her last rites. Upon noticing this, few people approached Odisha-Mo Parivar and intimated about the situation. Soon, with the help of MLA Sri Bikram Panda, all the required arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains to the crematorium where the last rites were conducted by the Odisha-Mo Parivar team. Our helpdesk associate Girija Sankar Satpathy coordinated the process.

The bereaved family was shocked by the sudden demise of Laxman and being under financial stress, they approached Pastor A. Anand Paul, who further discussed the matter with Sri Rudra Samantaray, Joint Secretray, Odisha-Mo Parivar. Soon, arrangements were made to transfer the mortal remains to the crematorium through Jai Odisha's hearse vehicle 'Sesha Saathi', where the last rites were performed as per the Christian rituals by the Odisha-Mo Parivar team.

2 Ranjan Pradhan, a 29-year-old resident of Bhubaneswar had dedicated his life to the service of mankind after his parent's demise. He was working as a volunteer in the Satyanagar crematorium during the pandemic to cremate the bodies. Not only that, he also donated blood to the patients during emergency and was recognised by many due to his selfless efforts to serve the needy.

Unfortunately, on 18th September he suffered a cardiac arrest and breathed his last. The local residents were saddened by his demise and this information came to the notice of Sri Rudra Samantaray, Joint Secretray, Odisha-Mo Parivar. Immediately, Sri Samantaray reached the spot and made required arrangements to transfer the mortal remains to the crematorium through Jai Odisha's

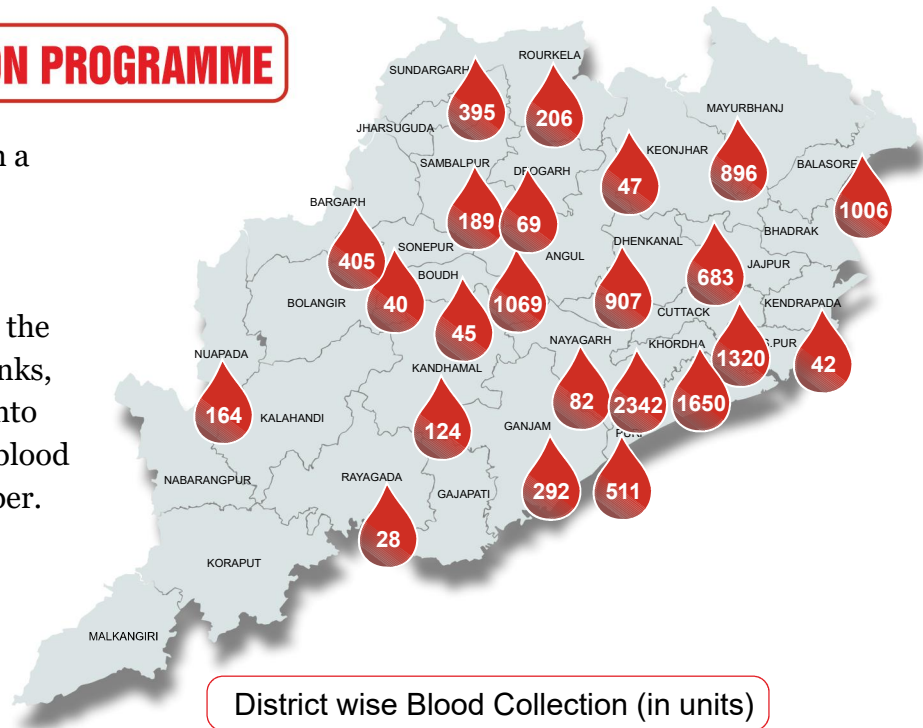
Special Blood Donation Camp of the Month

Prosthetics Support By Odisha-Mo Parivar



1 Ananda Barik, operates a small shop. In 1996, a thorn got pierced in his left leg which in time turned septic. Despite multiple treatments, the condition worsened over time, eventually leading to cancer and unfortunately, his leg was amputated below the knee in May 2004. He had availed two prosthetics before which worn out with time. S K Arshad, a social worker was aware of the provision of prosthetics by Odisha-Mo Parivar and upon knowing about Ananda, he informed Joint Secretary Shri Rudra Samantray. Ananda was then guided to visit ARC, Capital Hospital for measurement. After availing prosthetics Anand expressed his gratitude towards Odisha-Mo Parivar.

2 10 years back, while working on a fabrication project, Rabindra Parida met with an accident where, a piece of hot metal splashed on his right leg, causing a burn injury. He had to undergo surgery but with time, the injury turned septic and unfortunately, his leg was amputated on 3rd December 2022. He had not availed prosthetics before. One of his friends was aware of the provision of prosthetics by Odisha-Mo Parivar through Subrat Patika (Project coordinator, Odisha-Mo Parivar). Upon getting the information, Subrat discussed it with our helpdesk associate Alok Sahoo, who assisted Rabindra in the entire process of availing prosthetics at ARC Capital Hospital.



3 Surendra Kumar Pradhan, a 49-year-old resident of Nayagarh had met with an accident, resulting in a fracture in his right leg. He continued his treatment at various hospitals but with time some complications were noticed in his leg and unfortunately, his leg was amputated below the knee. He approached Ms. Linkan Subudhi, (State general secretary, BMJD), seeking help to avail a prosthetic and upon getting information from Ms. Subudhi, the beneficiary was guided to visit the ARC, Capital Hospital for measurement. After availing prosthetics, Surendra expressed his gratitude to Odisha-Mo Parivar.

ODISHA-MO PARIVAR'S CANCER CARE INTERVENTIONS

Odisha-Mo Parivar in association with Konark Cancer Foundation, assists cancer patients in logistical, emotional and financial aspects while helping them at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai, once they are referred.
