Mamta Sahu, a 67-year-old resident of Rayagada suffering from severe pain in her knees, was referred to Indus Hospital, Visakhapatnam.

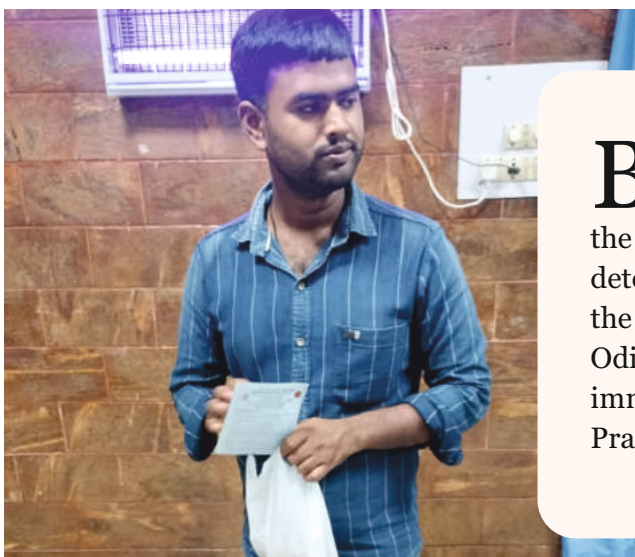

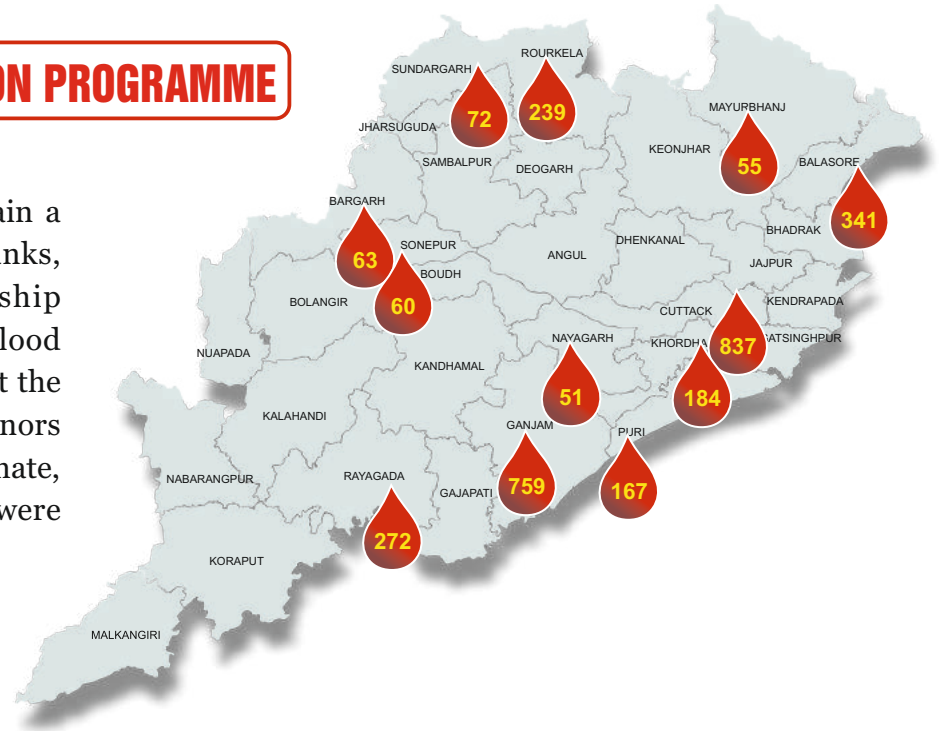

The case was handled by Dr. Murali Behera and after availing the prosthetic the beneficiary expressed his gratitude for the service rendered.

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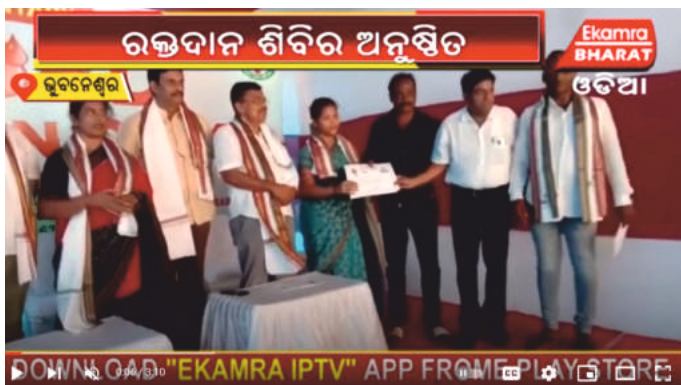
